## FROM THE DUGOUT



Welcome back to Badgers Hill for tonight's game against Slimbridge. Last weekend we picked up a point against Willand.

It was probably our worst performance of the season, and we still picked up a good point which has to be a positive. Willand were very good opposition on the day, and as I said pre match, were better than the league table suggested.

I am sure they will climb the table soon enough if they continue to perform as they did against us.

However, we need to be better. We were as far away from the levels of performance we put in against Barnstaple the previous week as possible. We have looked back at the game as a group this week and analysed aspects of the performance which we weren't happy with. We have trained exceptionally well the last week and I am hopefully we will see a reaction tonight.

We go into tonight's game on the back of a free weekend, which will have given everyone (players and supporters) the chance to take a breath after a hectic first few weeks of the season. I am hopeful we will see a fully rested, hungry and motivated group tonight to ensure our great start continues.

The weekend off also gave us all the opportunity to reflect and take stock as sometimes with games coming thick and fast, you quickly move on to the next, and rightly so. But sometimes it is worth stopping and assessing things.

Over the first 7 league games we have won 5, dew 2, accumulating 17 points which is the best points return at this stage for at least 10 years by some 6 points. We have scored 15 goals, the most goals in that time, and conceded 5 which is the least.



Its not only on the pitch where we are performing, as total attendances after the first 5 home games are only second over that same 9 year period, behind what we saw back in 2012 which included a 400+ gate against Chippenham, but still better than all other years including 2017, 16 and 15 which also included early home games against Weymouth and Chippenham respectively, which takes some doing!

We have also not had a gate lower than any of the previous lowest gates seen in that time period, which again is a massive plus and shows you are all consistently getting out to support the lads. So a massive thank you to everyone who has come out so far.

But you win nothing after 7 games, and we know how football can change quickly. So lets put that to bed and move on. Tonight will not be easy for sure. After a tricky start losing the first 3 games, Slimbridge have since gone on to win the last 3 league games.

After a 4-1 win at Mangotsfield they will be coming to us flying high on confidence.

Once again, on behalf of the players I would like to thank you for your support, hopefully you will enjoy the game and cheers us on to a good home win.


We were given a bye in the last round and have drawn Melksham Town (a). The draw is weighted to give less travel at the early stages.



Frome and Willand played out a fast paced contest in front a crowd of 305 at the Hill. The game became defined by two penalties with Hailston and Brown the heros for Frome.

The game started lively and the was no signs of Willand playing like a team at the bottom. Organised with a game plan to play out and force Frome back. The contest instantly became end to end. A few half chances fell the way of Frome Town, before Willand had the first real chance on 10 mins with Brown making his first of many telling contributions with an excellent save to his left.

On 22 mins, Mannings breaks down the right, playing a beautiful pass with the outside of his left foot through to Hailston, who hits a shot tamely to the keepers right.

The deadlock was broken on 29 minutes by Willand Captain Joe Curtis. A fast break from a throw down the right saw Rob Brown make a fantastic save and have to claw the ball back at the second attempt as the The clearance goes back to the edge and Joe Curtis curls it into the top right.

Frome responded with a fast breakaway that saw a teasing cross from O'Loughlin turn into a goal mouth scrabble. The clearance lands at Davies feet who put the final shot wide.

The game swung in Frome's direction as the pressure build. Cooper worked the ball down the right and fizzed in a low cross. Hailston reacted quickest to get in front of the last defender and the flick was enough to bring Hailston down.

Hailston stepped up and put the ball into the bottom left with the keeper left with no chance.

Halftime at the Hill allowed the crowds to catch their breath after a lightening paced first half.

Frome started the second half brightly. A swift series of one touch passes on the edge of the box created an opportunity for Cottle, who hit his shot straight at the keeper.

Willand reacted promptly with their biggest chance. Six yards out a clever turn sees the forward with just Brown to beat. He thundered the shot high and Rob Brown matched it. As Rob continued to prevent Willand from getting back in front.

Then Mannings broke away down the right, beating two before cutting in to fire agonisingly wide.

Next it was Davies turn as he stroked the ball towards the top right corner from 25 yards out, however keeper Searle acrobatically pushed it around the post. The crowd were on their feet as the end to end action at the hill continued.

Then the defining moment of the match. Teale was judge to have caught the forward in a incident similar to the penalty in the first half. However the penalty was saved by Rob Brown down to his right and the follow up was cleared off the line by an O'Loughlin overhead kick.

The pace did not let up and the introduction of Ryan Bath, helped Frome keep more possession in the Willand half as the pressure started to build. But it was Willand that hit the bar on 88 mins with a long range header, followed by a second chance saved by the legs of Rob Brown.

The last few minutes of injury time saw Frome have a few free kicks that were well dealt with by Willand.

A draw was a great result for both teams as this was a game that truly could have gone either way.

# THE TRAGIC STORY OF ABDELHAK NOURI

The Story of Abdelhak Nouri. In the hustle and bustle of day to day life in Amsterdam, the streets of smaller, more suburban areas like Geuzenveld are mostly overseen. For a teenage Abdelhak Nouri however, those streets were the foundation to what looked to be an incredible footballing career.

Nouri, 22, was a player that arose from a sea of talent at the Ajax academy, alongside players (and close friends) Donny Van De Beek and Frankie De Jong, De Jong being one of Barcelona's latest additions for a fee of £65m. Nouri's elegant, skilful playing style prompted comparisons to Spanish legend Injesta, something which certainly whet the appetites of many Ajax fans.

However, on July 8th 2017 in a friendly game against Werder Bremen in the Austrian Alps, he collapsed and due to 'inadequate response times' now is in a hospital bed suffering from severe brain damage.



It was said that the night before Ajax's match at the small, Linden Hippach stadium, Nouri had been suffering from stomach pains and had slept little. In the 72nd minute, shortly after replacing winger Hakim Ziyech, Nouri slowed, looked up to the sky and collapsed into the grass.

After teammate Klass Jan-Huntelaar panicked and signalled for help, it took just under a minute for all medical personal in the stadium to be at Nouri's side.


Amid players praying and others crying, doctors diagnosed Nouri had suffered from cardiac arrest, and began administering CPR. Around 7 minutes later a defibrillator was connected and used in the resuscitation process, before emergency services arrived to eventually rush Nouri to hospital via helicopter, in a described 'serious, but better condition'.

Upon arrival to hospital, scans showed some positive signs in regard to Nouri's condition, while he lay in an induced coma, although later tests unfortunately shone light on serious brain damage, suffered while Nouri struggled.

It has since been revealed by ex-Manchester United goalkeeper Edwin van der Sar,

that if response times were quicker, in regard to arrival, recognition that cardiac arrest was present and applying use of a defibrillator rather than focusing on 'clearing airways from club doctors', Nouri's condition could have potentially been much better

"We recognise our responsibility and liability for the consequences of this". Today in Amsterdam, so may tributes are in place to remind everyone what a sad loss Nouri was to football, but also to remind him, himself to stay strong, from a banner behind a goal in Geuzenveld he used to shoot in, reading: 'Appie 4 Ever', to a display in







the entrance of the Ajax museum, that states: 'Stay strong Nouri".

Teammate Van De Beek has also opened up about sitting aside Nouri's bed, much alike how they did after playing football while growing up. Furthermore, upon his agreement to sign for Barcelona in January 2019, De Jong visited Norui in hospital to talk to him and tell him the good news. 'Any interaction is positive.

Since Nouri has exited his coma and gained a low level of consciousness. there have been some signs of improvement, including limited communications, such as using his eyebrows to signal yes or no. Although recovery is possible, the chances are extremely low, and the chances of Nouri playing professional football again, even lower.

'A true Ajax heart', according to fans, and one that will never be forgotten.

Is it too early to get excited?

Frome's terrific start in the league has played tribute to the hard work the players and manager Danny Greave's chewed into over summer, and one man who will certainly be crucial this year is youngster Rex Mannings, who believes Frome's hunger to win will be their biggest asset this year.

"The main thing that has changed from last season is our hunger and desire to win and finish in the promotion places. The morale in the squad has risen too, all things which are looking promising".

From an individual perspective, Mannings is a thrilling attacking player who has the ability to turn a game on its head with one key pass or dribble. Because of his promise, I was intrigued to know what his goals were for Frome this season:

"My ultimate goal is just to help the club finish in a promotion spot, but personally I'd love to try and get more goals and generally just progress as a player".

Of course, any budding talent looks up to role models during their climb on the footballing ladder, something Mannings has clearly done, his discipline and mentality when preparing for a game, extremely impressive and comparable to some of the best.

"Before a game I always have scrambled eggs, nice and simple but great protein. I also make sure to have a good music playlist to help get me psyched.

left footed, I always put my left shin-pad, sock and boot on before my right counterparts and am always last out the changing room, I swear it helps".


If you watch Mannings play from the stands at Badgers Hill, it's clear to see his enjoyment and thrill of


playing in the red Robin's shirt shine through, something further supported through his admission of loving playing for Frome.

In The Beginning

The Club's history can be traced back to the 1899/1900 season playing in local football at various venues in and around the village. A gap in the records suggests there may have been a couple of seasons when no games were played, and thus, officially, the Club's centenary was celebrated in 2002/03. It was not until 1951 that the current ground at Wisloe Road was acquired, after a former player, Evi Thornhill, bequeathed it to the Club in his Will.

### Point Of Collapse

By 1988, a point of collapse approached, but fortunately, a handful of committee members kept the Club afloat. The following season local businessman Paul Chappell arrived. The Club was stabilised and construction of new changing facilities, to County League standard, were completed.

Start Of A New Reign

As playing standards improved, the building of a long awaited Social Club commenced in the 1998/99 season. The following year saw the introduction of John Mack, a súccessful local entrepreneur, as Chairman. In the summer of 2001, Doug Gray was appointed Manager.

After achieving the Runners-up spot in their first season in the Gloucester County League, the club were accepted into the Hellenic League. Hellenic Division One West was won by an eleven point margin

in 2002/03 and with it, promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division, where a creditable fourth place finish was achieved in 2003/04. In a marvelous season the club also claimed the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the G.F.A. Challenge Trophy.

Arrival Of Floodlights

The summer of 2003 saw the floodlights installed. A pre-season visit from Conference side Forest Green Rovers on 22nd July, produced a then ground record attendance of 427 to witness the inaugural floodlit game at Wisloe Road. A few weeks later on Sunday 24th August, that ground record was beaten at a Bank Holiday Hellenic Premier Division fixture that was part of the 2003/04 annual 'Ground Hop' weekend. Local rivals Shortwood United provided the opposition in front of a crowd of 525.

Rise To New Heights

Season 2006/07 proved the most successful in the Club's history to date, with both the First Team and Reserve side recording League and Cup doubles, with the added bonus of recordbreaking F. A. Cup and Vase runs for the senior side as well. In the F.A. Cup, a five match run from the Extra-Preliminary Round finished at Merthyr Tydfil in the Third Qualifying Round. Along the way there were memorable wins against two other Southern Premier sides, 2-1 at Yate Town and 3-1 at home to Chippenham Town.

It was six matches in the F.A. Vase before defeat was tasted, the run ending in the Fifth Round Proper at home to the eventual winners, Truro City.

In the Hellenic Premier Division, a solid start was established. Due to the Cup runs, and then bad weather, which led to a record number of postponements during the subsequently extended season, half a seasons fixtures had to be played in the final two months. A tremendous effort saw the Club bring the Championship Shield to Wisloe Road, the winning margin being three points over second placed North Leigh.

There was a rousing performance in the G.F.A. Trophy Final against Almondsbury Town. A 3-1 victory not only retained the Trophy, but recorded a third success in four seasons in that competition.

Promotion To The Southern League

Alongside the playing success, progress in the improvement of facilities allowed the First Team to be accepted into the BGB Southern League Division One Midlands for Season 2007/08, the highest level that the Club have ever operated at.

Return To A New Beginning

On July 10th 2007 the club decided not to take up the opportunity of playing in the BGB Southern League Division One Midlands for Season 2007/08, instead the club reverted back to the Gloucester Northern Senior League.

### Climb Back Up The Ladder

Four promotions followed as the club regained their previous status. The reins where handed over to Leon Sterling.

**Switching Leagues** 

After three top six finishes in the Hellenic Premier League, The Swans applied for a transfer to the Toolstation Western Premier League, a move approved by the FA in the Summer of 2013. This season

## **LAST SEASON**

Last season saw Slimbridge Finsih 18th in the division following a disappointing season for the Swans. represents the Club's first season in this league.

Return To The Southern League

After two seasons in the Toolstation Western Premier League, a third place finish at the end of the 2014/15 season gave the Swans a second opportunity to return to the Southern Football League. This time the club accepted the offer and took their place in the South and West division finishing a credible 18th.

#### Welcome To Thornhill Park

At the start of the 2016-17 season prior to our annual freindly fixture with neighbours Forest Green Rovers, the football ground in Wisloe Road was renamed in honour of the gift in 1960 from former Chairman Evi Thornhill of the land the club still occupies to this day.

Evi's son, Tony and his wife Margaret were on hand to cut the ceremonial ribbon, and Tony made a short heartfelt speech about how much the renaming meant to him and the entire Thornhill family, and how honoured they were that the football club had recognised their father in this way.

Changes On The Bench

After a run of poor results the club parted company with manager Leon Sterling in December 2016, his assistant Freddy Ward continued in the role for the following season brining in Lee Driver-Dickerson as his assistant and former Gloucester City player Lee Smith as player coach. After tough year, just avoiding relegation Freddy Ward stepped down as first team manager at the end of the 2017/18 season. Driver-Dickerson taking up the reigns.

**Progression Through Youth** 

A new Under 18's team, entering into the Midland Floodlit Youth League, Division 1 for the 2018/19 season. The move was a resounding success, seven of the Under 18 players stepping up to first team football during the season and Lewis Adams taking the number one jersey for the majority of the season.

Another step forward

At the start of the 2019/20 season the clubs fifth in the Southern League. Alex Lumsden an academy coach at Bristol Rovers and former Swansea player Dion Chambers joining Lee Driver-Dickerson's backroom staff.

## IF YOU KNOW YOUR HISTORY...

Frome Town, known at the Robins, were formed in 1904 and played in the Wiltshire Premier League. Early success came in the form of three Somerset Senior League Championships in between 1906 and 1911, whilst in between the Wiltshire League Championship was won in 1909-10.

The Club reached the Fifth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup in 1911-12 under the old format of the competition, which was today's equivalent of the Third Round proper losing 4-1 at Southport Central, in front of a crowd of 3.366.

Frome entered the Western League in 1919 and immediately became Division 2 Champions while the Somerset FA Senior Cup was won in successive seasons 1932-22 & 1933-34 & for a third time in 1950-51.

Frome have always played at Badgers Hill and the ground held its biggest gate in 1954 when 8,000 spectators saw Leyton Orient win 3-0 in the FA Cup First Round Proper. In the same season promotion was gained to Division One of the Western League & were beaten finalists in the inaugural Western League Cup.

Promotion was gained back into the Western League after a spell in the Wiltshire League again in 1962-63 where the club remained until 2009. Success was gained in the Somerset Premier Cup in 1966-67 with victory over Yeovil

Town in the final and the cup was shared by the same two teams in 1968-69.

Frome's greatest triumph came in 1978-79 when the club won the Western League.
The Championship was secured by losing only once in the last 32 matches.
The League Cup followed in 1979-80.

Another vintage year followed in 1982-83 with victories in both the Somerset FA Premier Cup and the Western League Cup, plus runners-up in the league.

Following those heady days, Frome flirted all too often with relegation from the Premier Division, and were relegated in 1995-96 and the Club spent several years in the lower reaches of the First Division.

The Club was re-structured off the field in 1999-00 but despite the ground being upgraded unfortunately success on the field did not follow with a re-structure of the league saving the Club from relegation into County football.

Frome improved rapidly and after finishing third continued upwards as they won promotion back to the Western League Premier Division after a six year absence the following year & also reached the final of the league cup.

With Frome struggling to win at home during the 2003/04 season the Club turned to the help of a local "White Witch", Titania Hardie. This move brought huge media interest from all over the World. It worked immediately and they went on a magnificent run that saw them go on to finish 3rd in the league.

The 2004-05 season saw the Club celebrate their centenary & events on the field saw the Robins reach the Quarter-Finals of the FA Vase before eventually losing 3-0 at Jarrow Roofing.

A seventh, third and fourth placed finish saw the club continually improving and then runners-up spot in 2008-09 secured promotion into the Southern League for the first time in the Clubs history. The Somerset Premier Cup was also secured with a 3-1 win over local rivals Paulton Rovers.

After a poor start to life in the Southern League and a quick change of manager Frome went on an incredible unbeaten run and finished the season in sixth place and just three points from a playoff place. 12 months later and Frome beat Sholing 1-0 in the play-off final to secure promotion

to the Southern Premier Division.

The summer of 2011 also saw the Club receive the prestigious FA Charter Standard Community Club status and, in 2012, after a great first season in the Southern

Premier Division the Club were awarded the title of Community Club of the year for Somerset and then also picked up the regional award that took them into the national final.

Over the last few seasons the Robins have retained their league status while also finishing as runners-up in the Southern League Cup and the Somerset Premier Cup.

2016/17 was our most successful league season to date with the Club finishing in a respectable 8th place in the Southern League Premier division with our highest points total.

After a difficult season Frome were relegated back to Divison 1 of the Southern League at the end of the 2018/19 season. With wholesale squad changes it will be interesting to see how this season develops.
