Goals from Rex Mannings, Dan Cottle and Joe O'Loughlin helped The Robins consolidate their lead at the top of the league with a 3-1 at home against Barnstaple Town.

Manager Danny Greaves made two changes to his Robins side ahead of proceedings, as Warren Maidment and Mannings came in for Marcus Mapstone and Rob Hobbs.

There would be a quickfire start from The Robins as they took the lead through Mannings after placing the ball past Steven Oliver with just over a minute on the clock.

Barnstaple dragged themselves back into the game having some of the play in Robins' territory, but Cottle would give the home side a two-goal lead as he slid and turned the ball home from close range.

A third Robins goal would come through Joe O'Loughlin, as he converted Cottle's cross to consolidate their lead on the half-hour mark.

The visitors pulled a goal back, after defender Mark Cooper conceded a handball just inside the area, and Barum captain Jack Jenkins duly dispatched the penalty past Rob Brown.

Full debutant Warren Maidment went close to restoring The Robins three goal advantage, as his powerful header cannoned off the bar.

The Robins wouldn't be troubled too much by the Devon side as much of

the game was played in the middle of the park as the game petered out to its rather inevitable end.

Frome remain at the summit of the Southern League Division One South as they extended their lead to three points, after six games.

# MENTAL HEALTH, HOW FOOTBALL CAN HELP

Regardless of your gender, race, age, job or background, anyone is prone to suffering from mental illness. New statistics show that now one in four people will suffer with mental illness in any year, and currently 10% of people are suffering from depression at any given time.

Though, all is not lost.

The stories of footballers Robert Enke, Frank Bruno and Marcus Trescothick (amid many more) all sadly remind the larger football family we all contribute

to, what, woefully, mental illness has the power to do to even the most successful athletes. Though more recent examples of players who have struggled, such as Aaron Lennon and Leigh Griffiths show in a much more positive light, how football can be used as a very effective vehicle to reach greener grass.

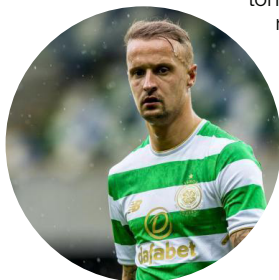
In December of last year, Celtic's number 9 Leigh Griffiths stepped back from football, admitting he had been struggling with depression, a similar story to that of, at the time Everton



and England International winger, Aaron Lennon.

Lennon's story first came to the public eye in April 2017, when a member of the public spotted Lennon on the side of the M602 motorway near Salford hospital, in a 'distressed state'. The player was later detained under the 'mental health act' by Police for his own safety. Since then, Lennon (who currently plays for Burnley) is a changed man, better described by Journalist James Ducker someone "who is enjoying his football again, and moreover, relishing his life again".

Beside the M602 was where Lennon's depression battle spiked, after what he later admitted was a long battle with the illness, mostly caused though being stuck in a profession he no



longer enjoyed. Although now, Lennon sees football totally differently, and credits it for helping out of his "dark days". "With all your help (the wider football community) I've managed to get myself in a great place and loving each day like you should, also learning so much about myself and learning how important the mind is and what I need to do to look after it.

"The football world has been brilliant to me, especially during difficult times. There are a lot of people I still need to thank and will thank." (A tweet from Lennon to his fans, on New Year's Eve 2017 before his transfer to Burnley).

It's stories like Lennon's that push the FA to really recognise mental illness in the game, and to their credit,



their efforts to tackle what sadly is now a widespread issue, have been outstanding.

The FA now offer a range of projects through all communities, catered to all people in a bid to achieve three specific goals; delivering social inclusion, helping physical health and improving people's mental health and outlook on life.

It's efforts like these that will hopefully in time help eradicate what has the potential to become a global epidemic, but in turn only highlights how powerful the beautiful game of football can be, in stopping it from doing so.

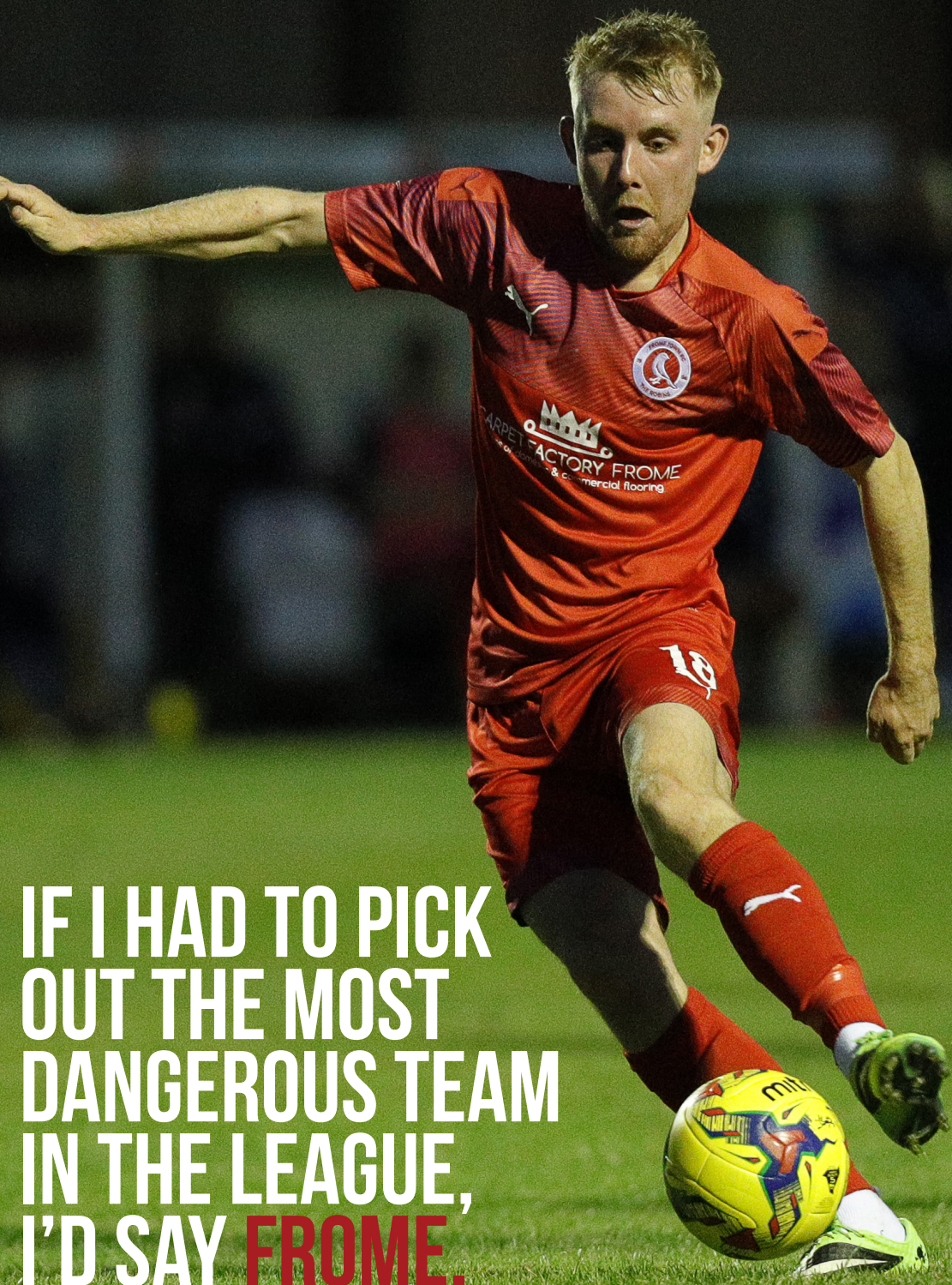

# FROME TOWN 2 - 1 FOREST GREEN

Frome Town Women opened their South West Regional Eastern League campaign with a visit from Forest Green Rovers Ladies hoping to kick on from last seasons unbeaten league title. Right from the start Frome knew they had stepped up a league as Forest Green passed the ball confidently for the first 10mins but Frome soon got to grips with the task in hand as Christer and Petteford both got into goal scoring positions but both failed to find the target.

Christer rectified that on 18mins opening her account with a slide rule finish past the out rushing keeper to put Frome 1 up. Soon after Restorick in goal for Frome produced a fine close range instinctive reaction save as Forest pressed for an equaliser.

McGregor on 25mins turned neatly on the edge of the area and shot goalwards but too close to the keeper. Both teams competed in the middle both trying to dominate and right on 35mins Forest Green took advantage of some hesitant defending in the six yard area to equalise with a somewhat scruffy goal after no real goal threat for 15mins. The away keeper the busier of the two kept her team in it again from an Isaacson shot following great pressure on the back four from McGregor and Petteford forcing the mistake.

A much changed Frome Town U18 played superbly here to get back on track after a disappointing opening day loss to a strong Corsham side.

With Frome extremely disappointing in the central midfield area in their opening day loss to Corsham in terms of movement, the entire central midfield was changed along with the keeper, 3 out of the 4 defenders were changed and 2 out of the 3 starting strikers were altered.

In total 7 new players were brought into the starting lineup while skipper Seviour was moved from midfield to attack & vice skipper Brewster was moved from central defence to defensive midfield. Frome controlled the first half and missed a succession of chances something which almost came back to haunt them in the second half.

With Cagilaba & Brewster dominant in the holding midfield area and Rudi providing a nice link to the attack Frome had much better possession

and were able to prevent counter attacks in addition. From goal kicks the key set piece in terms of ball retention keeper Locke was given enough movement and options by the defence and midfield to ensure Frome dominated proceedings in terms of the ball.

Welton were solid and did threaten and play some good football from the back themselves but Wheeler and Barnaby repelled any attacks effectively. Skipper Seviour roamed inside constantly from his nominal right side striker role creating a central overload that made counter pressing & short passing easy for Frome to achieve as he adapted well to his new role.

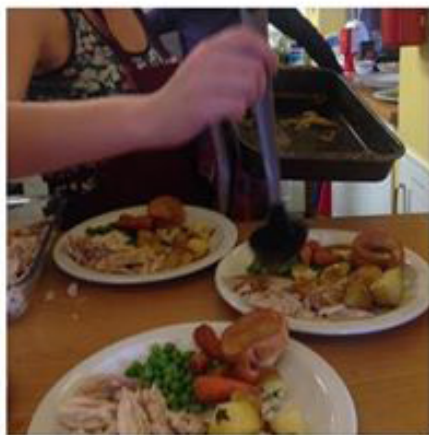

Rovers from humble origins to today! Football has been played in Willand for well over 100 years and the first match reports exist from November 1907, when Willand Association Football Club was under the chairmanship of Dr Henry Tracey of the Gables and played their home games at the Pavilion Ground, being the field opposite the Halfway House. The football club was still going strong by the years of the Second World War, when it was known as Willand Wanderers FC. However a spell in the financial doldrums left Wanderers going out of business and out of the ashes rose Willand Rovers.

During the 2nd World War and for a period of time after wards, the club played home games in Henry Eveleigh's field which is the land that, these days, is opposite the chip shop in Station Road, Willand. It was in the early 1950s that the club made the switch to its present home, Silver Street, now known as the Stan Robinson Stadium in deference to its main sponsor, Stan Robinson Transport. In 1972 Willand started the season there against near neighbours Tiverton Town in the Premier Division of the Devon and Exeter League. Interestingly enough, the K. O. was scheduled for 3.15. (To allow the crowds time to enter?) This season saw the first programme produced for match days with 40% of the proceeds on sales going to a prize draw.

For the opening match of 1972-3, the two teams included any number of

well-known local football names including, for Willand Rovers, Kenny Freeman and current club chairman, Mike Mitchell whilst Tiverton Town included Colin Campion, a relative of Dave Campion who was to go on and become Secretary of the club in early 21st century, along with Nick Seatherton, whose relative, Mark, was one of the stars of the Rovers Devon County League side in the 90's.

Under current manager Clive Jones, the club's rise continued with the County League being won in 1998-9 and again in 2000-1 followed by promotion to the Western League Division One and in season 2004-5, promotion as champions to the Premier Division of the same league.

Willand's standing in non-league football climbed to new heights in the last few seasons as they lifted the Les Phillips Cup in 2006/07 beating Welton Rovers in the final, after finishing runners-up to Corsham Town the previous year. Their then highest ever league position also followed in 2007/08 with a fantastic third place spot and that was bettered in a magical 2009/10 season that saw Rovers finish second only to Champions Bideford whilst they also reached the Fifth Round of the FA vase. In 2015-2016 after marathon 7 games were knocked out by Gosport Borough of the Conference South in the 4th Qualifying Round of the



FA Cup, just round away from playing in the competition proper.

At the end of the 2013 season long time manager Clive Jones stood down and was replaced by young duo Scott Rogers and Russell Jee. As they learnt their trade the club finished a respectful 8th last year in the league. At the end of the season which was Scott last game in charge of the team we won the Les Phillips Cup beating Barnstable in the final. This season we have had a tremendous FA cup final playing clubs from East London and the South Coast before falling to Conference South giants Gosport Borough. In 2015 saw Russell Jee taking over as manager with David Steele as his assistant.

Off the pitch the thriving fully refurbished club-house continues to help provide vital funding and the club also has a range of branded merchandise and local business, despite the hard times of the early 21st century recession continue to support, none more so that local haulage firm – Stan Robinson Transport who have increased their involvement with the club as "The Rovers", seek to maintain the impetus of the last few years. Other local businesses have continued to support the club and thanks to The Hickory Inn, Devon Tarmaster, Pencarrie for their involvement with us.

### 2018-2019 The History Makers

2018 was the Chinese year of the dog well for Willand it was a year when we ended up top dog. It was a year never to be forgotten and will take some effort to beat. We ended scoring 152 goals across all competitions. Steadily we marched on sitting top of the table for much of

the season, but come late April it was a 2 horse race we needed to draw the other side needed to win.

Travelling to third place Bitton, needing a draw to win the league, Bitton themselves could pip everyone if the calculators could work out the permutations. We got off to the worst possible start conceding a goal after 20 seconds, now the pressure was on but slowly we came into the game but could not find that allusive equaliser. On the hour we were reduced to 10 men when one of ours was sent off for protecting one of our players from getting thumped. With second place Parkway winning and now top of the league as it stood we needed something special from someone.

But true Champions find a way; they don't lie down in the face of adversity and 2 minutes after being reduced to 10 men, Luke Alden popped up with a sublime finish to gain parity. So for the first time in the club history we won the Western league and were promoted to the Southern league.

Some of those history makers have left some have moved away some have business and a young family to consider, but they will all go down in Willand folklore as heroes.

So Willand Rovers stand proudly at the highest point the club has reached in its short history. The this year will bring a different set of challenges, the decision has been made to start to develop the Stan Robinson Stadium, a new seating stand which can accommodate at least 50 seats is being sourced, ground in fill around the pitch side has been completed, a physio room and outside toilets have been added as we prepare for our first encounter with the Southern League.

The Club now has to consider whether to stay at Silver Street or move to a facility fit for purpose, with ever more development going on in the village and surrounding area now is the time to make that decision of where our home for the next 55 years will be. The last news is that in consultation with a local businessman and land owner we may well be placed to find Willand Rovers a new home in the next 5 years. The story goes on as the dream still unfolds...

# IF YOU KNOW YOUR HISTORY...

---

Frome Town, known at the Robins, were formed in 1904 and played in the Wiltshire Premier League. Early success came in the form of three Somerset Senior League Championships in between 1906 and 1911, whilst in between the Wiltshire League Championship was won in 1909-10.

The Club reached the Fifth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup in 1911-12 under the old format of the competition, which was today's equivalent of the Third Round proper losing 4-1 at Southport Central, in front of a crowd of 3,366.

Frome entered the Western League in 1919 and immediately became Division 2 Champions while the Somerset FA Senior Cup was won in successive seasons 1932-22 & 1933-34 & for a third time in 1950-51.

Frome have always played at Badgers Hill and the ground held its biggest gate in 1954 when 8,000 spectators saw Leyton Orient win 3-0 in the FA Cup First Round Proper. In the same season promotion was gained to Division One of the Western League & were beaten finalists in the inaugural Western League Cup.

Promotion was gained back into the Western League after a spell in the Wiltshire League again in 1962-63 where the club remained until 2009. Success was gained in the Somerset Premier Cup in 1966-67 with victory over Yeovil Town in the final and the cup was shared by the same two teams in 1968-69.



Frome's greatest triumph came in 1978-79 when the club won the Western League. The Championship was secured by losing only once in the last 32 matches. The League Cup followed in 1979-80.

Another vintage year followed in 1982-83 with victories in both the Somerset FA Premier Cup and the Western League Cup, plus runners-up in the league.

Following those heady days, Frome flirted all too often with relegation from the Premier Division, and were relegated in 1995-96 and the Club spent several years in the lower reaches of the First Division.

The Club was re-structured off the field in 1999-00 but despite the ground being upgraded unfortunately success on the field did not follow with a re-structure of the league saving the Club from relegation into County football.



Frome improved rapidly and after finishing third continued upwards as they won promotion back to the Western League Premier Division after a six year absence the following year & also reached the final of the league cup.

With Frome struggling to win at home during the 2003/04 season the Club turned to the help of a local "White Witch", Titania Hardie. This move brought huge media interest from all over the World. It worked immediately and they went on a magnificent run that saw them go on to finish 3rd in the league.

The 2004-05 season saw the Club celebrate their centenary & events on the field saw the Robins reach the Quarter-Finals of the FA Vase before eventually losing 3-0 at Jarrow Roofing.

A seventh, third and fourth placed finish saw the club continually improving and then runners-up spot in 2008-09 secured promotion into the Southern League for the first time in the Clubs history. The Somerset Premier Cup was also secured with a 3-1 win over local rivals Paulton Rovers.

After a poor start to life in the Southern League and a quick change of manager Frome went on an incredible unbeaten run and finished the season in sixth

place and just three points from a play-off place. 12 months later and Frome beat Sholing 1-0 in the play-off final to secure promotion to the Southern Premier Division.



The summer of 2011 also saw the Club receive the prestigious FA Charter Standard Community Club status and, in 2012, after a great first season in the Southern Premier Division the Club were awarded the title of Community Club of the year for Somerset and then also picked up the regional award that took them into the national final.

Over the last few seasons the Robins have retained their league status while also finishing as runners-up in the Southern League Cup and the Somerset Premier Cup.

2016/17 was our most successful league season to date with the Club finishing in a respectable 8th place in the Southern League Premier division with our highest points total.

After a difficult season Frome were relegated back to Division 1 of the Southern League at the end of the 2018/19 season. With wholesale squad changes it will be interesting to see how this season develops.
