Appeal by proponent against Council DA refusal was dismissed. A win for the community but uncertainty about "resolution" of issues other than parking.

Tomaree Headland Heritage Group: Geoff reported that THHG still trying to get information from State government about future plans for the site.Useful recent meeting with senior officers of relevant agencies. New signage has been erected,THHG still lobbying State member Kate Washington for information and decisions.
