IN THE SPOTLIGHT: MARCUS MAPSTONE

FEATURE BY ROB BIRD

With Frome's eyes still firmly fixated on the ultimate promotion prize, Danny Greaves may look back on the festive period with mixed reviews, Frome still in an excellent position, but one that could've been easily improved. This week I caught up with Marcus Mapstone, to discuss all things Frome.

"We've been a bit up and down over the festive period. Obviously, we're not happy with a couple of our results, but ultimately we need to stick together as a group to bounce back to winning ways as quickly as possible.

"Looking back on the first half of the season we couldn't have done much more. On a whole our performances have been good, we've just been unlucky that Thatcham are also having a great season, otherwise I think we'd be runaway league leaders."

With that one Thatcham sized hurdle left to conquer in the second half of the season, I was intrigued to investigate whether Greaves had implemented any tactical changes from Frome's previous performances – Would potentially perplexing Thatcham with revised tactics be

worth the risk of damaging Frome's exceptional football?

"No, we haven't changed a great deal at all. We've had a few injuries and suspensions to deal with, but every team goes through that. We just haven't been at our best at times over Christmas, hence the small blip in form".



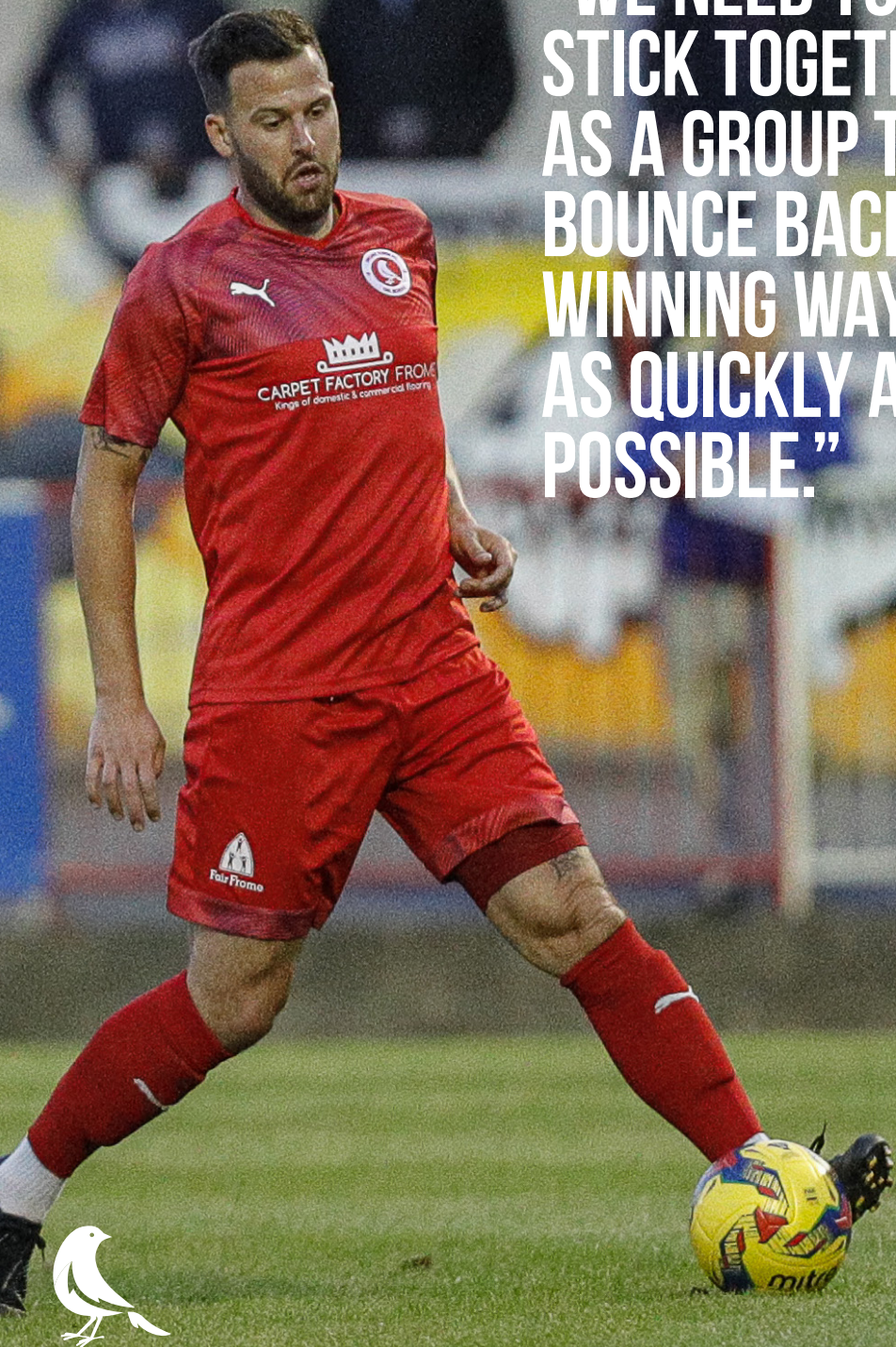
Similarly, to tactical changes, Mapstone also shone light on whether he'd be making any 2020 new year alterations:

"I try to avoid new year's resolutions as I find them far too easy to give up on. If I was going to make one this year it wouldn't be football related, instead it would be to lower my golf handicap.

"I do have a small pre-match ritual though in the sense I consistently require my pre-match caffeine boost, usually in the form of an energy drink. Age isn't on my side anymore, so any extra boost is welcomed!"

Although age may not bring improved stamina and increased drive however, it does help in some ways – for example reassuring yourself on your

dress sense, when you look back on those teenage pictures in disgust at that flamed shirt you're wearing.

On that note, Mapstone gave us an insight into who is the Gok Wan of East Somerset.

"Apart from myself, the best dressed has to be Tealey. He's pretty sharp on a night out to be fair, I think his barnet helps him out.

"Worst dressed is Monksy, although a few spring to mind. He comes to training in all sorts of different gear, I've given him the nickname scrapyard!"

And finally, best trainers – not as in Nike's – as in 'best at training'.

"Rex Mannings is the hardest worker in training by a mile, the kid loves football and his enthusiasm is unrivalled, he's like a dog chasing a tennis ball at times.

"Smithy is the worst, he gets a fine most weeks for being useless! He just tries to shoot from anywhere and everywhere, and ends up getting the ball nowhere near the goal".

Although so many components go into making a successful football club, from player ability, manager, squad morale, finances and so on, the single most important thing and main driving force behind Frome's ongoing success is the consistent support from loyal fans. To you, Mapstone had a few words:

The match began at a good pace, with both defences leading the way as many great passing moves from both sides were snuffed out by some fine defending. The only incident to go into the referees book was a yellow card for Cottle. The Marines thought they had taken the lead in the 44th minute, for the goal to be chalked off for offside.

The second half saw Swindon try to press home their early advantage, but our defence held strong. But on 56 minutes we came close to taking the lead when the ball fizzed across the goal for the keeper to make a fine save.

Even as the final changes were made from each side, the game always felt there was a goal in it and it came in unfortunate circumstances as Thomas-Barker miskicked a goal kick and Fleetwood was there to lob the ball back over the keeper to make it 1-0.

The celebrations were short lived, as for the kick-off as we went straight down into the Swindon box, where a penalty was awarded. Cottle dispatched the penalty to make it 1-1. Then in the 89th minute the ball fell to Mannings who fired the ball over and the match headed to penalties.

The penalties were enthralling as Swindon went 2-1 up after 2 penalties each. To see that bought back to 2-2, 3-3, 4-4, 5-5. Then came the misses both teams skied penalties, before the Marines smashed one off the bar and away. Up stepped Sam Teale to bury the winning penalty to put us through to the next round.

Rob Hobbs' New Year's Day brace helped Frome Town recover from their Boxing Day blues, as The Robins won 2-1 at home against Cinderford Town.

Robins manager Danny Greaves made one change to his side following the shock 4-1 defeat away at Melksham Town, as Rex Mannings came in for Dan Cottle.

Hobbs gave The Robins the lead after ten minutes, as he slid the ball home from close range, following some consistent pressure from the home side.

The opening 45 minutes meandered somewhat after The Robins opener, as there was much end-to-end football being played with little end product.

The Robins midfielder secured his brace just before half-time, as he latched onto a nice throughball after evading then Cinderford defence before slotting it past

the visiting 'keeper.

The visitors would find their way back into proceeding, just after the break, as Frome 'keeper Rob Brown fumbled a cross into the back of the net.

After The Foresters equaliser, the second half settled into the same end-to-end rhythm of the first 45, as neither side found themselves being able to carve open an opportunity for themselves.

A couple of unforced errors from the hosts gave the Gloucestershire side a foothold in the game, but they weren't able to consolidate and build on the pressure they started to exert.

Frome's first away trip of 2020 saw them venture to North Devon and Bideford Town where there is a long history of games between the respective clubs. With Mark Cooper suspended and Dan Cottle sick Chris Peck came into the starting 11.

The pattern of the game was unusual with both teams playing the long ball and Frome not really settling into their usual passing game. The first chance for the visitors came in the 9th minute when Kane Simpson did well to create himself a chance, beating the goalkeeper only to see his shot rebound off the inside of the post.

The deadlock was broken on 18 minutes when a long pass from Maidment found Simpson who cleverly flicked on for Davies to beat the last defender and score. Frome survived a penalty appeal before Bideford had their best chance of the first half, Brown saving a forced strike well and the rebounded effort being blocked by the defence to go in with a slender lead at half time.

Bideford emerged a changed team in the second half and had the visitors under almost constant pressure from the start with Frome rarely threatening until the half hour mark when Kane Simpson appeared to be impeded as he rounded the goalkeeper but nothing was given and Brown was again called upon to keep the lead intact.



Bideford secured a somewhat freak equaliser when a clearance smashed an attacking player in the face and rebounded to the striker who was free to score easily past Brown on 74 minutes. A minute later Alex Hallett recieved a straight red card for a foul as the last defender.

Bideford's second, and winning goal came on 82 when a free kick from the right side was steered back across the face of goal for an easy tap in.

Frome has one chance to draw level through Davies but the home goalkeeper made a great save and Frome were unable to convert the resultant corner

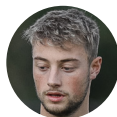
Rob Brown (Goalkeeper) Sponsored by Frome Cricket Club 3XI

Frome Town Women hosted Swindon Supermarine with hopes of 3 points after a narrow defeat in the reverse fixture earlier in the season and it started well with Isaacson hitting the post early doors. Frome looked up for it on a tricky heavy pitch and on 10 minutes Bristow forced the travelling keeper into a smart save from a good shot from the edge of the area, soon after Christmas broke through one on one after a great Isaacson through ball only to miss the target. **Christmas** relishing the slippery conditions found herself one on one again on 20 minutes but this time rounded the keeper and tucked the ball away nicely.

Frome started to turn the screw on the 10 players of Swindon and on 30 minutes Mist's fast feet in the area ended with a neat turn too good for Swindon's defender resulting in a Frome penalty, with a crowd behind the club house goal offering plenty on advice the birthday girl **Mist** stepped up confidently and side footed Frome's 2nd of the afternoon. Swindon still working hard up front couldn't get the better of the Frome defence who all worked tirelessly to get to the break with the 2 goal advantage.

Frome came out for the 2nd half looking to finish off the game with a 3rd and after 5 minutes did just that with a sweet strike from **Isaacson** leaving the visitors keeper no chance. Porch was unlucky not to get on the score sheet minutes later with an instinctive 1st time strike along with Bristow and McGregor shooting goal bound but the keeper somehow managed to keep them all out after prolonged Frome pressure. In the 75th minute **McGregor's** shot was too strong for the impressive visiting keeper to get anywhere near and not wanting to miss out **Brant** joined the party on 80 mins with an unstoppable left foot missile that nearly broke the net.

The club was established in October 1889. They played in the Cheltenham League, winning the Division One title in 1927-28 and again in 1929-30.

They joined the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League in 1935, but left after two seasons. Returning to the Cheltenham League, they were Division One champions again in 1948-49, before winning back-to-back titles in 1954-55 and 1955-56. In 1957 they rejoined the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League, but left again after finishing second-from-bottom in 1960-61. However, they returned for the 1962-63 season. They left the league again at the end of the 1963-64 season, but returned in 1965 and were runners-up in 1965-66, before going on to win back-to-back titles in 1966-67 and 1967-68.

In 1968 Cirencester were founder members of the Gloucestershire County League, but after a single season in the new league they moved up to the Premier Division of the Hellenic League. They were relegated to Division One at the end of the 1971-72 season, but were promoted back to the Premier Division after winning Division One in 1973-74. The club returned to Division One after finishing bottom of the Premier Division in the 1977-78 season.

The 1990-91 season saw the club finish as Division One runners-up, earning promotion to the Premier Division. They were Premier Division runners-up the following season, and won the league in

1995-96, earning promotion to Division One South of the Southern League.

The season also saw them win the Gloucestershire Senior Cup, beating Endsleigh 2-1 in the final.[6] The division was renamed Division One West in 1999, and after finishing third in 2003-04, the club were promoted to the Premier Division.[15]

The next few years saw Cirencester becoming a yo-yo club as they were relegated in 2007-08 and then promoted in 2009-10 after finishing fifth and winning the promotion play-offs, beating AFC Totton 3-2 in the semi-final and Bridgwater Town 4-3 in the final.

They were relegated again at the end of the 2011-12 season after finishing bottom of the Premier Division, but returned to the division after winning Division One South & West in 2013-14. They won the Gloucestershire Senior Cup again in 2014-15, beating Shortwood United 2-0 in the final.

2016-2017 saw changes at the helm after a poor start Brian Hughes was relieved of the manager's job and Charlie Griffin was installed as his replacement. The 2017-2018 saw a brand-new state of the art 3G pitch installed at The Corinium Stadium. After a slow start The Centurions missed out on a playoff spot on goal difference and disappointment was to follow last season after finishing runners up, promotion was denied via the play offs losing to Cinderford Town FC in the semi-final by 1 goal.

WHAT HAPPENED TO HAKAN SUKUR?



The Story of 'legend' Hakan Sukur
Imagine, you're a footballing legend, one of Europe's most prolific strikers and the all-time top goal scorer for your country. Life would be pretty sweet right? Well not for Hakan Sukur.

Before retiring in 2008, Sukur was a god, unable to stop finding the net for his national Turkish team and for club Galatasaray in the Turkish Super Lig, where he still holds the record for the all-time leading goal scorer. With his name held in such high regard, Sukur found an easy route into Turkish politics in 2011, winning a seat in parliament as a member of President Recep Tayyip Erdogan's Justice Development Party.

However, he was also tied to Fethullah Gulen, a Turkish Islamic scholar and rival of Erdogan, who the Turkish President blamed for a 'bloody attempted coup in 2016'.

By then, Sukur was already living out the American dream, or so he thought, with Turkish media branding him a 'fugitive member of the Fetulla Terrorist Organisation (FETO), an accusation that essentially completely destroyed Sukur's hometown status, despite his services to sport.

It was also suggested Sukur was living in a \$3 million house, in the rich Palo Alto area of San Francisco – in turn further aggravating Turkish citizens, this man they once held as a 'hero', living the dream at the peril of their countries pride.





However, Sukur tells a much blander story.

"I moved to the United States, initially running a cafe in California, but strange people kept coming into the bar. Now I drive for Uber and I sell books."

"Nobody seems able to explain what my role in this coup was supposed to be, I never did anything illegal, I am not a traitor or a terrorist."

"It's my country (Turkey), I love my people, even though their ideas about me are distorted by controlled media".

This dark tale can also be somewhat linked to the English leagues, with Arsenal midfielder Mesut Ozil in 2018 attracting criticism after posting an Instagram picture of him with the Turkish President, while the German Football Federation say: "football and the DFB defend values which are not sufficiently respected by Turkish President Erdogan".

Ozil, now retired from the German National team, has received much lighter punishment however than Sukur, now estranged from his home and stranded in the United states.

Despite the stories, should a hero ever be treated that way?

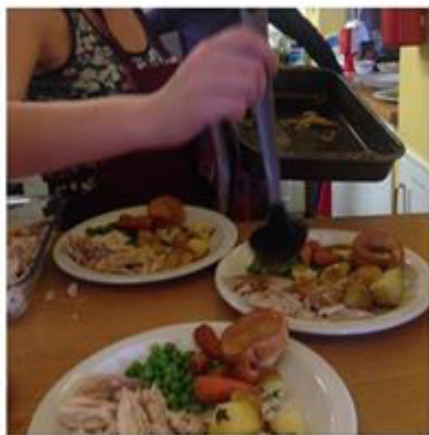

IF YOU KNOW YOUR HISTORY...

Frome Town, known at the Robins, were formed in 1904 and played in the Wiltshire Premier League. Early success came in the form of three Somerset Senior League Championships in between 1906 and 1911, whilst in between the Wiltshire League Championship was won in 1909-10.

The Club reached the Fifth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup in 1911-12 under the old format of the competition, which was today's equivalent of the Third Round proper losing 4-1 at Southport Central, in front of a crowd of 3,366.

Frome entered the Western League in 1919 and immediately became Division 2 Champions while the Somerset FA Senior Cup was won in successive seasons 1932-22 & 1933-34 & for a third time in 1950-51.

Frome have always played at Badgers Hill and the ground held its biggest gate in 1954 when 8,000 spectators saw Leyton Orient win 3-0 in the FA Cup First Round Proper. In the same season promotion was gained to Division One of the Western League & were beaten finalists in the inaugural Western League Cup.

Promotion was gained back into the Western League after a spell in the Wiltshire League again in 1962-63 where the club remained until 2009. Success was gained in the Somerset Premier Cup in 1966-67 with victory over Yeovil Town in the final and the cup was shared by the same two teams in 1968-69.



Frome's greatest triumph came in 1978-79 when the club won the Western League Championship by losing only once in the last 32 matches. The League Cup followed in 1979-80.

Another vintage year followed in 1982-83 with victories in both the Somerset FA Premier Cup and the Western League Cup, plus runners-up in the league.

Following those heady days, Frome flirted all too often with relegation from the Premier Division, and were relegated in 1995-96 and the Club spent several years in the lower reaches of the First Division.

The Club was re-structured off the field in 1999-00 but despite the ground being upgraded unfortunately success on the field did not follow with a re-structure of the league saving the Club from relegation into County football.

Frome improved rapidly and after finishing third continued upwards as they won promotion back to the Western League Premier Division after a six year absence the following year & also reached the final of the league cup.

With Frome struggling to win at home during the 2003/04 season the Club turned to the help of a local "White Witch", Titania Hardie. This move brought huge media interest from all over the World. It worked immediately and they went on a magnificent run that saw them go on to finish 3rd in the league.

The 2004-05 season saw the Club celebrate their centenary & events on the field saw the Robins reach the Quarter-Finals of the FA Vase before eventually losing 3-0 at Jarrow Roofing.

A seventh, third and fourth placed finish saw the club continually improving and then runners-up spot in 2008-09 secured promotion into the Southern League for the first time in the Clubs history. The Somerset Premier Cup was also secured with a 3-1 win over local rivals Paulton Rovers.

After a poor start to life in the Southern League and a quick change of manager Frome went on an incredible unbeaten run and finished the season in sixth

place and just three points from a play-off place. 12 months later and Frome beat Sholing 1-0 in the play-off final to secure promotion to the Southern Premier Division.



The summer of 2011 also saw the Club receive the prestigious FA Charter Standard Community Club status and, in 2012, after a great first season in the Southern Premier Division the Club were awarded the title of Community Club of the year for Somerset and then also picked up the regional award that took them into the national final.

Over the last few seasons the Robins have retained their league status while also finishing as runners-up in the Southern League Cup and the Somerset Premier Cup.

2016/17 was our most successful league season to date with the Club finishing in a respectable 8th place in the Southern League Premier division with our highest points total.

After a difficult season Frome were relegated back to Division 1 of the Southern League at the end of the 2018/19 season. With wholesale squad changes it will be interesting to see how this season develops.

them and their clubs. Non-League football thrives and survives on giving young footballers the opportunity to showcase their talent and the platform to push onto the League.

Are there more footballers just waiting for their chance? You can be sure of it.

In other news, Matlock Town have had their ground broken into for the third time in three months.

They certainly aren't the only Non-League club to suffer at the hands of mindless thieves.

It is soul destroying for the hard-working volunteers that put in all the hours they can to their club only to have to clear up the mess.

Unfortunately many Non-League clubs and grounds are soft targets. Often tucked away and with alcohol and other stock, or the prospect of cash left inside – they are an appealing proposition.

Clubs no doubt have insurance but the costs of additional security only add an extra burden.
