# PLAYER FEATURE: JOE O'LOUGHLIN

When asked the question, 'who do you think will be Frome's most important player for the rest of the season?' many immediately think goals, goals, goals before answering... 'Jon Davies', 'Kane Simpson' or 'Rex Manningsh'.

However, in the pole position Frome currently find themselves in, Joe O'Loughlin is undoubtedly someone who will be relied on extremely heavily as Danny Greaves looks to grind out consistent wins over the Christmas period.

"The ultimate goal for us this season is to gain promotion. Ideally we want to do that by winning the league, but it's obviously very competitive and we know how difficult that is going to be.

"The ability of the team only takes us so far; we need to ensure we're always dedicated and working hard to come back from losing positions and get results".

In comparison to Frome last season, many will agree that not only is the general feel around Badgers Hill improved, but so has the football on the pitch. Something O'Loughlin was keen to touch on.

"We've got a lot more variety in our play this year, there's been times when we've passed the ball really well and managed to get the likes of Jon and Rex into 1v1 positions, but on the other hand we've also played long and found success through the likes of Kane and Ryan too".

It's no doubt that O'Loughlin's ability is of top class, so I was intrigued to investigate what his personal footballing ambitions are:

"Ultimately I want to go as high as I can. I'm only young and being released from Exeter was a real setback, but since then I've started to really establish myself at Frome and am really enjoying my time here.

My main aim is to help the team climb the divisions and we'll see where we

go".


"As a full or wing back, my stamina is crucial when allowing me to get up and down the pitch for the whole 90-minutes and of late I've also improved my goal scoring ability!"

On the topic of goals however, O'Loughlin agreed with many others when asked: 'who's Frome's most prolific attacking player?':

"For me it has to be Jon, he's been brilliant the whole season in front of goal, but credit to Rex too as he's also been on fire"

An answer the certainly didn't come so easily however was that of 'who's the slowest in the team?':

"Hmm, there's a few up there for slowest. Hobbo, Cotts and Maps have all got to be in with a shout and I don't think I could split them. Snail race.



"On the opposite end of the spectrum, Rex and I always argue about who's quicker, but now Kane's come in he could give us both a run for our money".

A few more players that would give you a run for your money can be found when gazing upon O'Loughlin's dream 5-a-side team, and you have to say, it's pretty strong.

"I'd put myself in goal just to have the opportunity to play with these other 4 players. CM: Di Canio, LW: Ronaldinho, RW: Messi and ST: Brazilian Ronaldo (although Henry is up there).

Strong as that team is though, so is the one currently playing exceptional football at Badgers Hill. Powered through the constant support from Frome fans, O'Loughlin had a few words of thanks:





Frome's current run of away wins was bought to a surprising hault following a hard fought match in difficult conditions. A penalty miss and a last minute equaliser has seen Frome's lead at the top of table cut to just 3 points with Thatcham having 4 games in hand.

It was a fast start for Frome and after 8 mins a left foot strike from 25 yards saw Joe O'Loughlin claim his second goal in 2 matches. Then on 15 minutes Matt Smith picked up ball in centre circle ran through to slotted past keeper to make it 2-0 and looking pretty.



However, Moneyfields were awarded a penalty on 28 minutes. The initial penalty was well saved, but the ball fell kindly and Bailey found the back of the net following the rebound. In an eventful match Frome Town progressed into the next round of the league cup against higher league opposition in Dorchester Town. Given Frome's progress in the league and Dorchester currently struggling near the bottom of the league, both managers rang the changes. The match started brightly with both sides looking for openings.

However it was Simpson that had the first real chance of the match forcing the keeper into a comfortable save.

The opening goal cam on the 26th minute, as Joe O'Loughlin took advantage of defensively slip to beat the keeper. Simpson was again at the heart of the action, playing a great ball to set Cottle away but he can't take advantage. Cottle was brought down in the area but to his dismay nothing was given.

Dan Cottle's second half strike means little as The Robins continue their losing streak, as they conceded four against Basingstoke Town at Badgers Hill.

Basingstoke took the lead within the first ten minutes through Sam Argent, who slotted the ball past James Carey from close range. Carey signed from Championship side Bristol City in midweek, as Darren Behcet sustained an injury last time out in the loss against Hartley and Wintney.

The Robins had to keep out Argent once again as he evaded the offside trap, Carey was able to make a great stop to turn the ball around the post.

The visitors got their second of an impressive performance as Shane Hollamby as he managed to nod the ball into the back of the net.

Rickie Scott brought down Charlie Kennedy in the box and gave referee Stacey Pearson no option in awarding The Dragons a penalty, which was converted by Stow. There was one contentious moment before the break as Marcus Mapstone completed a strong challenge on an opposition attacker, which Pearson adjudged to be a foul and Mapstone received a yellow card.

Manager Danny Greaves made two changes at half-time as Ollie Knowles and Will Hailston were replaced by Conor McCormack and Dan Demkiv respectively.

Frome managed to get more of a stranglehold on the game after half-time, The Robins exerting more pressure on the Hampshire outfit. This pressure told as Dan Cottle curled a fantastic shot from 25 yards which fizzed past Basingstoke's Colm McAdden into the bottom left hand corner.

Frome conceded almost immediately as Sam Deadfield evaded the defence and slotted past Carey. The game then fizzled out as the contest ended, and Basingstoke were the winners as Pearson blew the final whistle.

We have a clubhouse with three bars, hot food served and a snack hut for those key essentials for keeping you and your children well fed.


All children under 16 are free to come

Officially formed in 1896 that a
Basingstoke Town F.C. club was formed
from Aldworth United and Basingstoke
Albion and in 1909 the local North Hants
Ironworks team merged with the Town
club. Leading to title success in 1911/12
and 1919/20.

After playing at a couple of grounds in the area the club moved to its present site in 1946. Initially the club had a fifteen-year lease given by 1st Viscount Camrose, but on his death in 1953 his son, 2nd Viscount Camrose increased the lease to 2052.

The sixties were the beginning of a more successful period for the Camrose club, finishing as runners up in 1965/66 and the following season. It was third time lucky in 1967/68 when the Hampshire League title was won. After being runners up again in1968/69 they won back to back titles in 1969/70 and 1970/71. The latter came without a league defeat and the Hampshire Senior Cup was won for the first time.

The club joined the Southern League in 1971/72. The highlight was reaching the F.A. Cup 1st Round for the first time ever. A then record attendance of 3,400 saw Northampton Town win 5-1 at the Camrose.

In 1984/85 the club won the Southern League Southern Division, without losing a home game. The club had the chance to move across to the Isthmian League. It was a disastrous first season as the club were relegated. The following year promotion was achieved with a last day victory at Southwick. The following year saw more cup success as the club reached the 2nd Round of the F.A.Cup for the first time. A crowd of over 4,000 saw Torquay United win 3-2. The Hampshire Senior Cup was won with a record breaking 8-0 thrashing of Lymington.

1997/98 saw F.A.Cup success over Wycombe Wanderers. After a draw at Adams Park, 2-2, the team won the replay on penalties after another thrilling 2-2 draw at the Camrose with a new record attendance of 5,085. In the 2nd Round it was an away trip to Northampton Town and despite being under pressure for much of the game the club earned a replay with a late equalizer. The replay live on Sky Sports and a crowd of nearly 5,000 saw Stoke this time go out on penalties

The next few years saw the club consolidating its position in the Ryman Premier League before coming members of the newly formed Nationwide Conference South in season 2004/05. During season 2006/07 the club had a marvelous F.A Cup run creating club history when beating Chesterfield 0 – 1 on there own ground in the first round proper. Unfortunately the run ended in the second round proper losing narrowly to near neighbours Aldershot Town in a replay at the Camrose.

The club were relegated to the Southern League at the end of the 2015/2016 season and the Hampshire Senior Cup was won again in season 2016/2017 beating AFC Bournemouth. 2018/2019 saw the club relegated again to the Southern league Divison 2 after finishing 20th.

# THE BEAUTIFUL, CHANGING GAME?





The introduction of VAR isn't the first big changes in football, with the introduction of substitutes, back passes, offside laws all causing some controversy before being accepted. Here's a list of 5 new potential rules that could see the face of football change again...

#### 1. No direct red card for a last man foul.

One man certainly in the public eye at current is Manchester United manager Ole Gunnar Solskjaer. However when

looking back on his playing days in red, aside from the heaps of goals, one of Ole's finest moments came when Newcastle's Rob Lee, with the score poised at 1-1, broke from a United corner finding himself clear on the Red Devils' net, if it wasn't for a last ditch foul from a sprinting Solskjaer who was quickly dismissed after. However, it could be that this rule of an immediate red card for a last man foul can change, if there is a legitimate intention to win the ball. Undoubtedly alongside the use of



VAR, officials if they believe there was a genuine intention to play the ball, would be able to issue a yellow card for a last man foul. This applies to the goalkeeper also.

#### 2.Yellow card Sinbins.

The rugby World Cup in Japan captured the attention of most of England last month, but a similar rule within the game of rugby could soon be seen in football, sinbins. If an offence is bad enough (but isn't worthy of a straight red card), it has been alluded to that sinbns could be introduced to the modern football game, rendering the guilty party unavailable for a certain amount of time. Currently in rugby the sinbin time is 10-minutes, although this may not be the same if the rule is introduced to football. After serving their time, the player can then be reintroduced to the game. The idea of a "blue card" is already being trialled, just a division below

3. Replace the penalty shoot-out. Exciting for the neutrals, horrible for those involved (especially if you're English). The penalty shoot-out has been under fire for long periods of time, many labelling it an awful way to decide a competitive game which takes into account none of the previous 90, or 120 minutes of football and relies too heavily on the goalkeeper alone. So why not change it? Because nobody really has any other ideas. The most common suggestion is the implementation of the golden goal rule, which essentially means 'next goal wins', although there are also many issues with this ranging from broadcast time limits, to spectator travel arrangements.

#### 4. Scrap VAR for TMO

VAR. VAR. VAR. VAR. I'm sick of it too, but it could be that VAR is changed after a turbulent introduction into the professional game. Once more looking at rugby, their TMO (Television Match Official) system not only induces auicker decisions from officials, but is much clearer. Unlike VAR. TMO shows the incident on large screens across the stadium, keeping fans in the loop and allows television viewers to hear the conversations. taking place between the referee and other officials, therefore justifying their eventual decision, something which on many occasions has been hard to do so in football

#### 5. No rebound goals from penalties.

The stress of missing a penalty can sometimes be immediately squashed when you see the ball bounce off the goalkeepers glove straight back to the attacker to pass into an open net, however a potential new rule could stop this. It's been alluded to that rebound goals from penalties may soon be disqualified in a bid to make it fairer for goalkeepers. If the same player who took the penalty was to then score with their next touch after the ball returned to them. via the goalkeeper or post, play would be stopped and a freekick awarded to the defending team. However, if another player (who didn't take the penalty initially) was to score, this would remain legal.

# IF YOU KNOW YOUR HISTORY...

Frome Town, known at the Robins, were formed in 1904 and played in the Wiltshire Premier League. Early success came in the form of three Somerset Senior League Championships in between 1906 and 1911, whilst in between the Wiltshire League Championship was won in 1909-10.

The Club reached the Fifth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup in 1911-12 under the old format of the competition, which was today's equivalent of the Third Round proper losing 4-1 at Southport Central, in front of a crowd of 3,366.

Frome entered the Western League in 1919 and immediately became Division 2 Champions while the Somerset FA Senior Cup was won in successive seasons 1932-22 & 1933-34 & for a third time in 1950-51.

Frome have always played at Badgers Hill and the ground held its biggest gate in 1954 when 8,000 spectators saw Leyton Orient win 3-0 in the FA Cup First Round Proper. In the same season promotion was gained to Division One of the Western League & were beaten finalists in the inaugural Western League Cup.

Promotion was gained back into the Western League after a spell in the Wiltshire League again in 1962-63 where the club remained until 2009. Success was gained in the Somerset Premier Cup in 1966-67 with victory over Yeovil

Town in the final and the cup was shared by the same two teams in 1968-69.

Frome's greatest triumph came in 1978-79 when the club won the Western League.
The Championship was secured by losing only once in the last 32 matches.
The League Cup followed in 1979-80.

Another vintage year followed in 1982-83 with victories in both the Somerset FA Premier Cup and the Western League Cup, plus runners-up in the league.

Following those heady days, Frome flirted all too often with relegation from the Premier Division, and were relegated in 1995-96 and the Club spent several years in the lower reaches of the First Division.

The Club was re-structured off the field in 1999-00 but despite the ground being upgraded unfortunately success on the field did not follow with a re-structure of the league saving the Club from relegation into County football.

Frome improved rapidly and after finishing third continued upwards as they won promotion back to the Western League Premier Division after a six year absence the following year & also reached the final of the

league cup.

With Frome struggling to win at home during the 2003/04 season the Club turned to the help of a local "White Witch", Titania Hardie. This move brought huge media interest from all over the World. It worked immediately and they went on a magnificent run that saw them go on to finish 3rd in the league.

The 2004-05 season saw the Club celebrate their centenary & events on the field saw the Robins reach the Quarter-Finals of the FA Vase before eventually losing 3-0 at Jarrow Roofing.

A seventh, third and fourth placed finish saw the club continually improving and then runners-up spot in 2008-09 secured promotion into the Southern League for the first time in the Clubs history. The Somerset Premier Cup was also secured with a 3-1 win over local rivals Paulton Rovers.

After a poor start to life in the Southern League and a quick change of manager Frome went on an incredible unbeaten run and finished the season in sixth place and just three points from a playoff place. 12 months later and Frome beat Sholing 1-0 in the play-off final to secure promotion

to the Southern Premier Division.

The summer of 2011 also saw the Club receive the prestigious FA Charter Standard Community Club status and, in 2012, after a great first season in the Southern

Premier Division the Club were awarded the title of Community Club of the year for Somerset and then also picked up the regional award that took them into the national final.

Over the last few seasons the Robins have retained their league status while also finishing as runners-up in the Southern League Cup and the Somerset Premier Cup.

2016/17 was our most successful league season to date with the Club finishing in a respectable 8th place in the Southern League Premier division with our highest points total.

After a difficult season Frome were relegated back to Divison 1 of the Southern League at the end of the 2018/19 season. With wholesale squad changes it will be interesting to see how this season develops.

# NLP: PLAYER INSURANCE IN THE SPOTLIGHT

The court ruling that has seen Ossett United ordered to pay £135,000 will have given Non-League clubs plenty of food for thought about how they approach the issue of player-to-player insurance.

The BetVictor Northern Premier League North West club have been sued by Rees Welsh, who broke his ankle in a tackle while playing for Radcliffe Borough against Ossett Town in April 2015.

Just over £19.000 in damages were awarded to the full-back, making his debut, with the club also having to pay out £115,000 in costs and legal fees.

Ossett's insurance, which included a public liability policy offered by the Northern Premier League and the minimum requirement as set out by the FA, did not cover player-to-player incidents and only covered their own legal fees should they lose a claim.

The club is now considering selling their ground in order to pay off the heftv bill.

NPL chairman Mark Harris told The NLP: "We make it clear within all. the communications - and it's in the third line of the first paragraph of the communication that goes out to clubs - that it does not include player-toplayer cover.

"We will continue to recommend the policy we have for public liability and personal accident. If anything this is to remind clubs it doesn't include plaverto-player."

Whether the ruling will spark a wave of cases remains to be seen. It remains true that these incidents are very hard to prove, but there is no doubting it will leave much of the Non-League game very uncomfortable.

As it stands, the FA don't have playerto-player insurance as mandatory. Clubs are - or at least should be - aware of what they are covered for and that there is a potential risk of what has happened to Ossett happening to them.

Harris believes clubs don't have an appetite for that level of cover to be mandatory and the FA say their rules are reflecting what the game wants.

It is only right the authorities reflects on this case, takes the views of clubs and experts and then decides the best course of action.

Will this also put additional pressure on referees? As the sole independent party in these types of cases, a lot will be put on their reports and evidence. It is quite the position to be in.

We must also not forget about Welsh. It can't have been an easy route to go down and, however you feel about the ruling, he has suffered a major injury that will have affected not only his footballing career, but also his day-today life.

The impact of any injury to any player can't be underestimated.
