Our opponents today, Dorchester, have made it to the final twice 91/92 losing to Dover 4-0, then to lift the trophy in 01/02 beating Kings Lynn 4-0.

Our only final appearance ended in heartbreak after losing in extra time 2-1 against Arlesey Town in 12/13.

The Current holders are Stratford Town who beat Cinderford 1-0 last season.

Frome Town emerged victorious from this top of the table local derby at Badgers Hill. With both teams pushing for promotion, a number of players having links to both sides, recent history and an excellent crowd of 455, the largest in the division today, you could expect the game to be a bit tense and so it proved.

Frome started brightly but the visitors soon found their way into the game and had a succession of corners in the early stages although they failed to trouble Kyle Phillips in the Frome goal.

The first chance for Frome came on 13 minutes when Joe O'Loughlin whipped in a wicked cross from the left which was met by Mannings whose effort was blocked on the line and somehow scrambled away for a corner. Mapstone then shot wide of goal, and Mannings again on the half hour mark before Paulton had their first real chance as league top scorer Ben Bament beat the offside flag to go 1v1 with Phillips but put his shot high and wide. As the half came to an end Phillips was on hand to save another chance with his trailing foot and ensure the teams went in level. Frome started the second half on the front foot and Davies was unfortunate with a free kick that dipped just over the bar.

The usual free flowing football was only sporadic but the home side seemed most likely to score and Davies broke the deadlock on 65 minutes with a feint to send the goalkeeper the wrong way and a cool left foot finish to open the scoring.

Shortly afterwards Paulton almost took advantage of a loose pass but Alex Monks was on hand to clear

the danger before a superb

20 yard effort for the visitors hit the top of the crossbar and rebounded to safety. Paulton threw everything forward in an attempt to get an equaliser but the home defence held firm and the game should have been over I

the 92nd minute when Davies unselfishly presented Cottle with the ball in the 6 yard line with an open goal begging and somehow it looked over the crossbar. Cottle was to make amends just 60 seconds later with a composed left foot finish to seal the game and send the home support away with smiles on their faces.

Frome travelled to Melksham on Monday evening for the first round of the Southern League Cup. Whilst this competition is taken less seriously than most, Danny Greaves making 5 changes from the team that was successful against Totton on the weekend, the local rivalry and links to both clubs from so many players, managers and officials meant that there was plenty to play for.

Melksham's new facility is impressive and the pitch was in excellent condition. The game got under way with Frome on the front foot without really threatening the Melksham goal. Melksham played a high pressing game attacking with pace whilst Frome's game plan was more measured. It was the hosts that claimed the first goal when former Frome favourite Luke Ballinger found himself in plenty of space on the left side of the Frome penalty area and hit his shot firmly past Rob Brown in the Frome goal.

Jon Davies wasn't long in scoring Frome's equaliser and what a goal it was, a right foot rocket from range giving Bartlett no chance and its fair to say he enjoyed it having endured a bit of abuse from the home fans up to that point. Frome basically controlled the game from this point onwards and the first half ended 1-1.

With the half time whistle blowed the visitors were in a good position.



Founded in 1880, Dorchester Town Football Club participated in The Dorset League from 1896 to 1947, and The Western League between 1947 and 1972, before joining The Southern League, where they remained until gaining entry into the newly formed Football Conference South in 2004. They were relegated back into The Southern League in 2014.

Relegated from The Premier Division at the end of the 1983/84 season, following a severe financial crisis, they only just avoided dropping out of the League in season 1985/86. However, a remarkable transformation was achieved, and Dorchester returned to The Premier Division as Champions at the end of the following season.

For most of the seasons that they were back in The Premier Division, Dorchester were a mid-table team but season 1997/98 saw The Magpies achieve their highest ever Premier Division placing when they finished in fourth place, but the next two seasons were very disappointing, with relegation only just being avoided on both occasions and in 2001 The Magpies lost The Premier Division place that they had held for fourteen seasons. The Magpies threatened to regain their Premier Division status in their first season in The Eastern

Division, but finished in third place behind. The following season, when after a fine campaign, with only five defeats, the Club returned to The Premier Division as Champions.

In season 2003/04 Dorchester won The Southern League end of season play off competition, defeating Bath Citý in the Semi-Final and Tiverton Town in the Final, played at Exeter City's St. James Park, to gain entry to the newly formed Conference South. Following their elevation to the Conference regional division, the Magpies finished eighth place, which was a great achievement for the small market town of Dorchester with a population of 15,000. Sadly season 2013/14 The Magpies finished rock bottom, and were relegated back into The Southern League Premier Division

In May 2013 Chairman Shaun Hearn transferred half of his majority shareholding in the club to the Community Trust, with the commitment to see D.T.F.C become fully community owned. This is a daunting, but exciting, venture, which should bring long-term benefits to both the club and the wider community as they become more closely involved with each other.

Nick Hutchings

Nick joined The Magpies in December 2018 on a non-contract basis. Nick was previously with Poole Town, whom he had been with for eight years, and he had made over 330 appearances for The Dolphins.

Shane Murphy

Shane has returned to The Magpies for a second spell, having previously made his debut in April 2014, and has spent the past two years with AFC Totton. In his first spell with the club Shane made 76 first team appearances.

Kyle Egan

Kyle, a right sided defender, has committed to The Magpies again for a second season, having played a complete campaign as a Magpie last season.

Neil Martin

Neil, a versatile defender, initially joined The Magpies in August 2009, and was a consistent performer, but decided to leave the club to join Poole Town in November 2013. He subsequently joined neighbours Weymouth before deciding to re-join The Magpies prior to season 2015/16. Neil is a skilful, versatile player who can play either at left back or left wing back.

Michael Peck

Michael, a central defender, and a product of The Argyle Academy, has joined The Magpies on a loan agreement from his parent club Plymouth Argyle until the end of November.

Callum Rose

Callum, who can play anywhere in the back line, initially joined The Magpies on loan from his then parent club Plymouth Argyle in October 2017, making his debut for The Magpies against Basingstoke Town in The FA Trophy. Callum had spent time at Aston Villa's Academy, and played local junior football, before joining Argyle's Academy in the 2014-15 season.

Tiago Marques Sa

Tiago, who is a young versatile defender, signed for The Magpies in the close season, having been with Weymouth last season. Tiago also had a short loan spell with The Magpies in September 2018. Born Portugal.

Dan Strugnell

Dan is an experienced defender, who is arguably The Magpies' marque signing for the new season, having previously been with National League side Havant & Waterlooville, initially on loan, since November 2012, where he made over eighty appearances and scored five goals.

Ben Symes

Ben has progressed through The Magpies' youth structure, and is a now a member of The Academy Squad.

Alfie Toland

Alfie has progressed through The Magpies' youth programme, and is now a member of The Academy squad.

Tom Blair

Tom is a midfield player, who joined The Magpies prior to the 2016-17 season. Tom has become a regular fixture in the first team squad for the past three seasons, and has now made over one hundred appearances and scored twenty goals. Born Dorchester.

Jason Brookes

Jason is a versatile utility player, who has also returned to the club, after leaving at the end of the 2017-18 season. Jason initially joined The Magpies prior to season 2014-15, having previously been a scholar at The Southampton Academy.

Franklyn Clarke

Franklýn is an energetic, physical central midfielder with a strong work ethic, and can also operate as a target man as well as in the engine room. He has also appeared for Blackfield & Langley, Poole Town, Salisbury, York City and Wimborne Town

Charlie Davis

Charlie, is an attacking midfield player, who likes to get forward whenever the opportunity arises, and has rejoined The Magpies, having originally joined the club for a short loan spell in October 2014.

Charlie Gosney

Charlie has progressed through The Magpies' youth structure, and is a member of The Academy Squad.

Billy Lowes

Billy has re-signed for The Magpies for his third season with the club, having previously been with Weymouth. Billy has also had spells in the academies of AFC Bournemouth and Yeovil Town, and he then joined Poole Town where he won The Young Player of the Year award.

Oli is a midfield player who has signed for The Magpies, having previously spent time at Poole Town and has also spent seven years in The AFC Bournemouth Academy. Currently dual registered with Dorchester Sports.

Tom Purrington

Tom has signed for The Magpies on loan until January from his parent club Plymouth Argyle, having progressed through The Argyle Academy to the U18's, and represented Argyle in last season's FA Youth Cup run when both Manchester City and Burnley were eliminated.

Luke Winsper

Luke was with neighbours Weymouth for a number of seasons prior to that, during which time he progressed through the youth and reserve teams before breaking into the first team on a regular basis during the 2013-14 season. Luke has now resigned for The Magpies for the new campaign.

Sean Wright

Sean is a young central midfielder, who is held in high regard by Manager Callum Brooks, having previously worked with Sean at both Hamworthy United and Poole Town.

Tom Bath

Tom, a renowned striker, who has signed for The Magpies having been with Tiverton Town for the previous three seasons, where he scored forty-five goals in one hundred and forty-three appearances.

Eder Batista

Eder, a Brazilian, has previously appeared for Poole Town and Hamworthy United, and has now joined The Magpies.

Klaidi Lolos

Klaidi, a striker, has joined The Magpies on a loan agreement from parent club Plymouth Argyle until January 2020. Klaidi has previously also played for Olympiakos, has spent time in The Crystal Palace Academy, and been on trial at Birmingham City. Klaidi is now a first-year professional at Argyle, has been called up into Greece's U19 squad, made his debut for the first team when he came on a substitute against Newport County in Sky Bet League Two, and subsequently made his first start against Bristol Rovers in The Leasing. com trophy.

Ben Morris

Ben is a local player, who plays in a wide position, and who progressed via reserve team football with The Magpies to become a member of the first team squad last season, when he made his first team debut.

River Smith

River is a talented young striker, with a tremendous work-rate, who has joined The Magpies prior to the new campaign. River had a very good goals to appearances ratio with one of his previous clubs, Bournemouth Poppies, last season, and River also appeared for Hamworthy United in the 2018-19 season.

There was no lack of commitment and effort from Frome in this match, but once again, scoring goals was the main problem, and after more than matching Dorchester for an hour, they fell behind to a penalty and despite searching for an equaliser right up to the final whistle, it failed to materialise and Frome slipped into the relegation zone as Dorchester overtook them.

With the squad missing the suspended Sam Teale and Kane Simpson, Dan Whitly made his first home start and Frome started brightly as Tristan Plummer cut in from the right to deliver a searching low cross that was just cleared, and with Plummer driving a shot just wide of the far post in the 10th after a period of Frome pressure, the home side were definitely in the driving seat at this point.

However, as the match settled, Dorchester came into their own and started to play the ball more in the Frome half, though with the Frome defence looking settled, the contest

developed into an even, keenly contested one with neither side able to carve out any real chances.

Frome had a shout for a penalty in the 34th as a ball seemed to bounce up and strike the hand of a defender, but the referee was in a good position to see things clearly and he immediately decided that there was no offence, and after more midfield stalemate, Frome went close in the 40th as a dangerous free kick was whipped in by Plummer only to be cleared by the head of a defender and the score remained 0-0 at half time.

Frome again had the better of the first ten minutes after the restart, and with Ollie Knowles clipping a free kick just over and stinging the palms of Kingsley Latham with a left foot shot in the 54th, the home side were obviously still up for the challenge.

However, as the game opened up, Dorchester showed that they were a force to be reckoned with on the counter attack and they went very close a minute later as a shot from a tight angle on the right flew across the face of the Frome goal and out for a corner.

Dorchester's free kicks left a bit to be desired as for the second time. the attempted shot on goal flew ten yards over the goal in the 59th, but they then took the lead in the 62nd as Frome lost possession in midfield and a guick break led to Cameron Murray cutting across the front of Kris Miller only for Miller's legs to tangle with Murray's rear leg and the referee immediately pointed to the spot and booked Miller for the challenge. Ben Sevmour took the kick and scored with ease with a spot kick that no keeper in the world would have saved.

Dorchester missed a huge chance to double their lead four minutes later as a Frome clearance was charged down allowing the visitors to quickly work their way through the defence, and after James Carey had made a very good save to deny Seymour, the ball ran free to Harry Kite Kite who somehow managed to put it wide from around five yards out.

The goal meant that Frome had to do something to get back into the match, and despite substitutions in the forwards, Connor Roberts started coming forward from defence and looked the most likely to create something, but Dorchester now looked composed with a three man defence with two hard working wing backs who were tracking Frome attackers when needed, but getting forward to support their attack on the counter.

No matter what Frome tried, the Dorchester defence always proved that little bit smarter and stronger, and as the minutes ticked away and legs tired, they always looked the more likely to score again on one of their counter attacks, and Frome's only real chance of an equaliser came in the 95th minute as a corner led to a volley crashing into the defensive wall just as the final whistle blew.

The result now means that Frome have lost their last four matches by a single goal to sides around them in the table, and with each match being effectively a "six pointer", the lack of goals is becoming a serious issue, hopefully to be addressed on Saturday with the visit of old rivals Poole Town.



IF YOU KNOW YOUR HISTORY...

Frome Town, known at the Robins, were formed in 1904 and played in the Wiltshire Premier League. Early success came in the form of three Somerset Senior League Championships in between 1906 and 1911, whilst in between the Wiltshire League Championship was won in 1909-10.

The Club reached the Fifth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup in 1911-12 under the old format of the competition, which was today's equivalent of the Third Round proper losing 4-1 at Southport Central, in front of a crowd of 3.366.

Frome entered the Western League in 1919 and immediately became Division 2 Champions while the Somerset FA Senior Cup was won in successive seasons 1932-22 & 1933-34 & for a third time in 1950-51.

Frome have always played at Badgers Hill and the ground held its biggest gate in 1954 when 8,000 spectators saw Leyton Orient win 3-0 in the FA Cup First Round Proper. In the same season promotion was gained to Division One of the Western League & were beaten finalists in the inaugural Western League Cup.

Promotion was gained back into the Western League after a spell in the Wiltshire League again in 1962-63 where the club remained until 2009. Success was gained in the Somerset Premier Cup in 1966-67 with victory over Yeovil

Town in the final and the cup was shared by the same two teams in 1968-69.

Frome's greatest triumph came in 1978-79 when the club won the Western League.
The Championship was secured by losing only once in the last 32 matches.
The League Cup followed in 1979-80.

Another vintage year followed in 1982-83 with victories in both the Somerset FA Premier Cup and the Western League Cup, plus runners-up in the league.

Following those heady days, Frome flirted all too often with relegation from the Premier Division, and were relegated in 1995-96 and the Club spent several years in the lower reaches of the First Division.

The Club was re-structured off the field in 1999-00 but despite the ground being upgraded unfortunately success on the field did not follow with a re-structure of the league saving the Club from relegation into County football.

Frome improved rapidly and after finishing third continued upwards as they won promotion back to the Western League Premier Division after a six year absence the following year & also reached the final of the league cup.

With Frome struggling to win at home during the 2003/04 season the Club turned to the help of a local "White Witch", Titania Hardie. This move brought huge media interest from all over the World. It worked immediately and they went on a magnificent run that saw them go on to finish 3rd in the league.

The 2004-05 season saw the Club celebrate their centenary & events on the field saw the Robins reach the Quarter-Finals of the FA Vase before eventually losing 3-0 at Jarrow Roofing.

A seventh, third and fourth placed finish saw the club continually improving and then runners-up spot in 2008-09 secured promotion into the Southern League for the first time in the Clubs history. The Somerset Premier Cup was also secured with a 3-1 win over local rivals Paulton Rovers.

After a poor start to life in the Southern League and a quick change of manager Frome went on an incredible unbeaten run and finished the season in sixth place and just three points from a playoff place. 12 months later and Frome beat Sholing 1-0 in the play-off final to secure promotion

to the Southern Premier Division.

The summer of 2011 also saw the Club receive the prestigious FA Charter Standard Community Club status and, in 2012, after a great first season in the Southern

Premier Division the Club were awarded the title of Community Club of the year for Somerset and then also picked up the regional award that took them into the national final.

Over the last few seasons the Robins have retained their league status while also finishing as runners-up in the Southern League Cup and the Somerset Premier Cup.

2016/17 was our most successful league season to date with the Club finishing in a respectable 8th place in the Southern League Premier division with our highest points total.

After a difficult season Frome were relegated back to Divison 1 of the Southern League at the end of the 2018/19 season. With wholesale squad changes it will be interesting to see how this season develops.
