In a commanding league position and in fine form, Danny Greaves will not only want to further sharpen the goalscoring abilities of the attacking players in the side, but just as crucially ensure the back four are watertight. To achieve that, it starts with a quality goalkeeper, and Rob Brown was in high spirits after Frome's incredible 2-0 win away to Barnstaple.

"To go to Barnstaple and come away with all 3 points is massive and shows our quality, they're a very good side". Victories alike the one at Barnstaple only further highlight the potential of this Robins side, and Brown is driven to fulfil that potential to the maximum.

"We aim to hopefully win the league or reach the playoffs this season, we're definitely capable of doing both.

"We're moving the ball quicker and playing in wider areas, we're also more confident from playing out from the back. You can see the side improving every week".

Aside from on-pitch abilities however, Brown was also keen to mention the physical and mental attributes that equally need to be in top condition, something that highlights his personal drive and footballing intelligence.

"Fitness is massive in this league, it's really physical and we need to make sure we never fade in games. It's important to work hard and stick together too, that's how we'll win games".

As Frome fans, we all know the quality Brown possesses between the sticks, so I was eager to question

him on his personal footballing career aspirations:

"At the moment I'm just keen to keep playing at a decent level with Frome. I'm eager to carry on playing well and we'll see where that leads.



"WORK HARD AND STICK TOGETHER THAT'S HOW WE'LL WIN GAMES".

"I'm always driven to improve, I'd say kicking is my best attribute, but there's always room to grow".

One question we failed to ask Rob was whether with his long range kicking whether he fancies getting on the score sheet this season...

Another player clearly eager to grow, and currently performing at his very best in Rex Mannings, who's recent scoring statistics have many excited for his future in a Robins kit.

"Rex has been dynamite this year, and he'll be our golden boy this season if he carries on the way he's going".

"He always gives it everything in training and you can see that pay off on gamedays".

I think many will agree one attribute that makes Mannings so exciting and dangerous is his pace, something not always possessed by everyone however, according to Brown. "Slowest in the squad is probably me! Or maybe Maps as well. Rex is obviously rapid, but I'd say JD is the fastest.

The season however is a marathon, not a sprint. If Frome are to continue to be a domestic force, they'll continually require the loyal support from all Robins fans. To you, he wanted to show appreciation.

"I'd like to thank all the fans for their support week in, week out. Hopefully we can gain promotion this season, and with your backing nothing is ever impossible"

Two goals from Davies and a cracker from Smith wasn't enough as we bowed out to Carshalton in the FA Trophy. In a Tuesday night match that was full of entertainment and action.

The match hinged on two fast starts to the halves by Carshalton that ultimately left Frome chasing the game. The excitement at the War Memorial Sports Ground, got under as Carshalton put the early pressure but on 4 mins a swift counter attack saw Mannings shoot narrowly wide. A minute later back up the other end Carshalton had a shot deflected over the bar, and from the resulting quick corner, there was no one there to tap in the inviting cross. But it was on 10 mins the deadlock was broken, a through ball to Korboa left Maidment standing and Korboa beat the on rushing Brown to the ball to put the hosts in front.

It was quickly doubled as the referee played a good advantage and Carshalton extended their lead with a cross from the right easily turned home. Carshalton smelt blood and only the woodwork came to Frome's rescue. Monks was robbed in the centre circle, a blistering attack followed which saw the shot hit the



post. The next attack which saw Brown make a comfortable save. Danny Greaves shuffled his pack. Davies moved up front to partner Simpson and attempt to make something happen. It worked and after a free kick on the corner of area narrowly avoided Mapstone. On 31 mins Cooper found Davies and with the outside of his right foot, he finds the top corner from outside the box.

The cheering was short lived as the comeback halted instantly. A long range shot is fumbled by Brown in the Frome goal and the striker nips in to finish it off to make it 3-1. However, Frome where buoyed be the fact that they had scored. Going into half time there was still some positivity. The next goal would be key...

After a another fast start a shot from edge of the box, travelled through 4 defenders and into the bottom corner to make it 4-1 to the host. But as the celebrations died down, Smith fired in a quick response from from outside the box. Back to 2 goals behind and a more nervous home crowd. Attacking changes from Greaves took place as we went for broke in the hunt for a third. It came as Davies broke into the area, his low shot and snuck in as home keeper that fumbles it make it 4-3.

The speed of Carshalton's attacks were always causing problems, and on 70 mins a cross from the left beats the last man and it's an easy tap in to extend the lead to 5-3.

Into the last 20 minutes and we had the oportunties to score a fourth with Simpson and Cooper coming close. When the board went up to show three added minutes Simpson thought we had our fourth to set up a mad last few minutes. But it wasn't to be as the linesmans flag went up.

The Cup run ends but all those associate with Frome can hols their heads high as we definitely didn't go out with a whimper.

This weekend saw the Robins travel West down to Barnstaple, in a top vs bottom clash at this point in the season. With us topping the table on points with many of our rivals having games in hand. On paper this one looked like an easy game to call but we know that any game at this level can go either way, with a heavy pitch and unfavourable weather conditions.

However, Frome Town secured another 3 points on their travels with a valuable win at Barnstaple Town to continue to be unbeaten away this season in the league. Danny Greaves had perhaps has an eye on Tuesday night's away FA Trophy tie at Carshalton with his team selection. With Sam Teale and Dan Cottle moved to the bench to allow Warren Maidment to take a place in the starting 11 along with the returning Jon Davies. The other change of note was Rob Brown was unavailable and Kyle Phillips took his place between the sticks.

It didn't take long and we got off to a dream start in the 4th minute when a clever pass from Mannings released Kane Simpson who beat the keeper to take the lead. This was Simpson's second goal since returning back to the club and Mannings taking his tally to three assists this season.

The game was always going to be about the hosts ability to take their chances when they were presented. They created a couple of opportunities which they spurned without really troubling Phillips in the Frome goal. It was a professional display by Frome that saw the first half drew to a close at 1-0.

A Barnstaple fight back was expected as the teams came out for the second half, but it was Frome start brightly and put the hosts under pressure from the first minute. After some good football the goalkeeper was called on to make a smart save at the feet of Mannings.

The keeper was again back in action and produced another good save again with his feet when Kane Simpson broke through, as the we started to dominate the game.

In the 69th minute Frome scored their second and effectively killed the game. Davies delivered in a fine free kick from the right hand side, Marcus Mapstone was on hand to turn it in at the near post. You could sense the game was now settled and that Frome would protect their lead to see out the win.

The home goalkeeper, however was determined to keep the score respectable and pulled off one more excellent save from Simpson. Then Matt Smith tried to cap an excellent performance with a fine long range effort from that clipped the crossbar on 80 minutes. The final few minutes were played out in what can only be described as a very professional performance. Three more points on the board.

The next 25 minutes saw Frome come close to doubling their lead with Bristow shooting just wide,a lung bursting box to box run from the youthful Perkins ending with her shooting into the keepers arms and a McGregor pile driver rebounding off the post. The constant pressure down the right produced Christmas a sharp chance but her volleyed effort cleared the bar.

Trowbridge still posed a threat and picked up a contentious free kick on 85 minutes 30 yards out when Underhill rose well to head out a floated ball in and Trowbridge's striker colliding with her and landed awkwardly. The resulting free kick saw a perfect strike into the "top bins" which saw Trowbridge react as if it was the winner, but with 5 minutes plus added to play Frome pushed forward but were unable to grab a winner.

On the balance of chances Frome must feel 2 points dropped but for Trowbridge a point gained.The supporters player of the game went to debutant Freya Mist who came on midway through the 1st half showing good touches.skill.great energy and tackled anything that moved.

Town played well in possession of the ball here against their opponents from the division above but yet again their play out of possession particularly when being counter attacked was their achilles heel.

Frome went into this game with the pacey powerful Carver back to fitness after a long injury layoff. In addition Frome tried a slightly different balance in the midfield with Brotherton making a first start and Russell starting for the first time since the opening day of the season. Frome started the game well in terms of possession and goal kick structure with midfielders Brewster, Russell & Brotherton keenly looking for possession of the from goalkeepers possession and having enough quality and awareness to breakdown the aggressive Weston Super Mare press.

In turn skipper Seviour's excellent movement off the front allowed Frome a systematic build up with good running in behind by the pacey Porter & Carver stretching the Super Mare back line. Carver in particular impressed with some powerful runs down the right resulting in crosses that could not quite be converted. Super Mare it must be noted showed good quality in terms of recycling possession across the back line but Frome's pressing pattern was reasonably good other than an issue with regards to fullbacks/mezzallas being too deep to affect play once play was switched.

Frome found themselves behind to a scrappy first goal about 30 minutes in. However Frome struck back with a brilliant goal constructed down the left side which saw Seviour get in behind using the left side interior corridor before finishing superbly for 1-1. Frome however switched off on a corner yet again with a failure to zonally mark at the far post allowing Super Mare a simple tap in on the far side after a corner was not cleared. Just before half time Frome conceded another goal from an open play cross and header to find themselves 3-1 down at the break.

The second half was a bit of a non-event from Frome's point of view with relatively good approach work with the ball being undone by a lack of width/counter pressing from fullbacks not overlapping enough.

This in turn was caused by a lack of holding midfield players to cover for the fullbacks on forward forays meaning the fullbacks were reticent to go forward fearing a lack of cover. In addition this lack of natural holding midfield players allowed Super Mare to execute a number of successful counter attacks in central areas.

To this end Frome ended up losing the match 6-1 although they were unfortunate not to get at least one more goal after a good press ended with Seviours block on the keeper bouncing just wide.

As a conclusion Frome's management need to find the right balance between midfield players who hold deep positions to block counter attacks and facilitate width from advanced fullbacks by covering for them when play breaks down and these same holding players must also be able to show the high technical knowledge and ability to facilitate playing out of the back in the way the Frome midfield did so excellently in this match which enabled Frome to play good football in possession.

THE FORGOTTEN ART?

Thus far this season, Frome have demonstrated an increased workrate, passion and intelligence for defending, one main reason supporting their impressive start domestically.

However, for many defending as a whole has over-time become an artform slightly forgotten about, it's importance and the skill of defending overshadowed by flamboyant attacking play.

The most evident example of this is fullbacks. Only looking back as recently as the 80's and 90's, the fullback position today compared to then is drastically different. A great example is Giuseppe Bergomi, a legendary Italian fullback whose expert defending and physical presence could've easily seen him just as respected in a central position.

At present however, players alike Bergomi come few and far between, with now the likes of Trent Alexander-Arnold and Andy Robertson branded as two of the world's best, almost solely due to their goal scoring and assist tendencies.

So why is this. Well according to ex-Manchester United and England defender Gary Neville, it all traces back to management and training.





"With old-school coaches' 60-70 percent of training would be defensive, where your feet should be, the position of your hips, how often you'd be ball watching. I compare it to a musician stripping a song back to its elements".

"The others and I (who retired in around 2010) were the last crop of predominantly defensively trained players. Back then if a fullback was to cross it was seen as a crime, today is barely seems to register. The technical and attacking work is now around 80 percent, with 20 percent reserved for training, and standards have really dropped".

Neville's credible insight into this issue can also be supported when studying the vast array of exciting youth talents braking thorough, with the majority playing in attacking roles like Jadon Sancho and Callum Hudson-Odoi, with only a few in comparison defensively minded and equipped.

When looking at Frome this season however, this analogy can be challenged. In The Robin's last 10 League fixtures, they've conceded only 12 goals, an average of 1.2 per game.

To put this into perspective Tottenham Hotspur who boast internationally experienced defenders like Jan Vertonghen, Toby Alderweireld and Davison Sanchez have conceded 1.42 goals a game on average this season.

More than likely down to Greaves' preseason work, which has consistently seen players praise the morale of the squad, as well as their improved on-pitch abilities from last season, if Frome can continue to exert quality defensive performances, while the likes of Jon Davis and Kane Simpson grab the goals, they'll ultimately find themselves near the top, come the end of the season.

Rob Brown (Goalkeeper) Sponsored by Frome Cricket Club 3XI Rob signed for Frome in January 2019 having spent the first half of the season with Paulton Rovers, having gained promotion from the Western League the season before with Melksham Town. A young 'keeper who continues to improve.

Mark Cooper (Defender) Coops rejoins for his third spell at Badgers Hill, the first being when he was released from Bristol Rovers as a teenager. In between he has represented Weymouth, Chippenham & Melksham and will bring valuable experience and undoubted guality to the defence.



Joe O'Loughlin (Defender) Sponsored by Lee Jones Joe is a great prospect, formerly with the Exeter City academy he is now studying at Bath University. Defensively strong and also quick to get involved going forwards.

Paulton Rovers were formed in 1890. The club joined the Western League in 1900 and the best ever position was runners up in 2003/4 securing promotion to the Southern League. They won the Somerset Senior Cup on twelve occasions, and the Somerset Senior League seven times, the last being in 1974, when they were re-admitted to the Western League after an absence of fourteen years. Their best attendance of 2,070 was on 7 November 2009 reaching the FA Cup 1st Round for the first time. The match v Norwich City, was live on ITV1 and to over 30 other countries. Prior to then a crowd believed estimated at over 2.000, saw them take on Crewe Alexandra in the FA Cup 5th qualifying round in 1906.

Rovers moved to Winterfield Road in 1954. In 1967, an old RAF hut served as the club house with a licenced bar. Soon plans were drawn mortgage to build bigger premises including skittle alley. The pitch was turned 90 degrees so the club house is built on the one penalty area's. The social club is now the premier venue for many social occasions within the rapidly expanding local community. It was under the management team of Darren Perrin and Mike Kilgour that, Rovers secured promotion to the Southern League. Rovers finished just outside the play-offs in the following season and Darren left for Premier Division, Chippenham Town.

In July 2005 Andy Jones stepped up

from Reserve Manager. In 2006/7 the club finished runners up in Division 1 South & West Division One and narrowly missed out on the play offs the following year. His successful 5 year tenure was highlighted by reaching the 1st round of the FA Cup. 2011, Nick Bunyard took over, the season ended with Rovers winning the Somerset Premier Cup for the first time with a 3-1 win over Bridgwater Town.

After losing out in the play off the previous year in 2013/14 Rovers finished 4th spot and defeated Tiverton Town 3-1 in the semi final when down to 9 men, "Bunny's" men defied the odds to win the Play off Final at Merthyr Town in front of a crowd of 2.201 and thus gain promotion to Step 3 for the first time in their history.

2014/15 finished a more creditable 10th place in the Premier Division, during the close season Bunyard, resigned for personal reasons and the club appointed Richard Fey from Bridgwater Town, but after a disappointing start he resigned and former Bath City boss Tony Ricketts took charge at end of October. Unfortunately the club finished bottom and relegated back to Division 1 South and West.

Despite stabilising things Ricketts left at the end of 2016/17 and former Rovers keeper John Rendell was appointed bringing former player Paul Tovey as his assistant.

So, on the day when Liverpool and Manchester City were locking horns in the top echelons of English football, it was perhaps fitting that the Maldon & Tiptrees of this world were enjoying their 15 minutes of fame.

Now one thing I must also confess is that when asked my "expert" opinion of all things Non-League whether Maldon & Tiptree could actually go to National League champions Leyton Orient and beat them in their own back yard, I told them to keep their money in their pocket! What do I know anyway?!

Once again, I had underestimated the magic of the FA Cup – but isn't that what we just love about this competition? How does little Maldon & Tiptree, of Isthmian League Division One North actually turn up at Brisbane Road wearing a Barcelona-style kit and beat a team four leagues above them in the Pyramid playing like...well, Barcelona?

For anyone who thinks I'm exaggerating, take a look at Jorome Slew's fine solo winner in front of the ecstatic Jammers fans behind the goal? Jammy it was most certainly not. And it wasn't just Maldon & Tiptree who conjured up their bit of magic at the weekend. At the same time, Kingstonian were putting a throwntogether crisis club Macclesfield side to the sword at Moss Rose to earn a second round tie with AFC Fylde and ensure there will be at least one Non-League club at the third round stage.

Earlier, Dover Athletic enjoyed their big day in front of the BT Sport cameras by beating League One Southend United at Crabble. It set us up nicely for a Sunday Funday where Bromley held Bristol Rovers to a 1-1 draw and Altrincham stunned their league's leaders York City to earn a mouth-watering away tie at Portsmouth, FA Cup winners of course just 12 years ago under Harry Redknapp.

So, with no fewer than 15 clubs left in the competition before next week's first round replays – including another Step 4 side Chichester City, who were rewarded with an away tie at either Tranmere Rovers or Wycombe Wanderers after receiving a first-round bye – the magic of the FA Cup will no doubt return come November 30.

Hopefully, by then, the Premier League ignoramuses might actually have an idea who to put their money on!

IF YOU KNOW YOUR HISTORY...

Frome Town, known at the Robins, were formed in 1904 and played in the Wiltshire Premier League. Early success came in the form of three Somerset Senior League Championships in between 1906 and 1911, whilst in between the Wiltshire League Championship was won in 1909-10.

The Club reached the Fifth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup in 1911-12 under the old format of the competition, which was today's equivalent of the Third Round proper losing 4-1 at Southport Central, in front of a crowd of 3,366.

Frome entered the Western League in 1919 and immediately became Division 2 Champions while the Somerset FA Senior Cup was won in successive seasons 1932-22 & 1933-34 & for a third time in 1950-51.

DME TOWN

Frome have always played at Badgers Hill and the ground held its biggest gate in 1954 when 8,000 spectators saw Leyton Orient win 3-0 in the FA Cup First Round Proper. In the same season promotion was gained to Division One of the Western League & were beaten finalists in the inaugural Western League Cup. Promotion was gained back into the Western League after a spell in the Wiltshire League again in 1962-63 where the club remained until 2009. Success was gained in the Somerset Premier Cup in 1966-67 with victory over Yeovil Town in the final and the cup was shared by the same two teams in 1968-69.

> Frome's greatest triumph came in 1978-79 when the club won the Western League. The Championship was secured by losing only once in the last 32 matches. The League Cup followed in 1979-80.

Another vintage year followed in 1982-83 with victories in both the Somerset FA Premier Cup and the Western League Cup, plus runners-up in the league.

Following those heady days, Frome flirted all too often with relegation from the Premier Division, and were relegated in 1995-96 and the Club spent several years in the lower reaches of the First Division.

The Club was re-structured off the field in 1999-00 but despite the ground being upgraded unfortunately success on the field did not follow with a re-structure of the league saving the Club from relegation into County football. Frome improved rapidly and after finishing third continued upwards as they won promotion back to the Western League Premier Division after a six year absence the following year & also reached the final of the league cup.

With Frome struggling to win at home during the 2003/04 season the Club turned to the help of a local "White Witch", Titania Hardie. This move brought huge media interest from all over the World. It worked immediately and they went on a magnificent run that saw them go on to finish 3rd in the league.

The 2004-05 season saw the Club celebrate their centenary & events on the field saw the Robins reach the Quarter-Finals of the FA Vase before eventually losing 3-0 at Jarrow Roofing.

A seventh, third and fourth placed finish saw the club continually improving and then runners-up spot in 2008-09 secured promotion into the Southern League for the first time in the Clubs history. The Somerset Premier Cup was also secured with a 3-1 win over local rivals Paulton Rovers.

After a poor start to life in the Southern League and a quick change of manager Frome went on an incredible unbeaten run and finished the season in sixth place and just three points from a playoff place. 12 months later and Frome beat Sholing 1-0 in the play-off final to secure promotion to the Southern Premier Division.

The summer of 2011 also saw the Club receive the prestigious FA Charter Standard Community Club status and, in 2012, after a great first season in the Southern Premier Division the Club were awarded the title of Community Club of the year for Somerset and then also picked up the regional award that took them into the national final.

Over the last few seasons the Robins have retained their league status while also finishing as runners-up in the Southern League Cup and the Somerset Premier Cup.

2016/17 was our most successful league season to date with the Club finishing in a respectable 8th place in the Southern League Premier division with our highest points total.

After a difficult season Frome were relegated back to Divison 1 of the Southern League at the end of the 2018/19 season. With wholesale squad changes it will be interesting to see how this season develops.
