As you know, from today the Government has introduced new Covid-19 regulations. As a professional football club we owe a duty of care to everyone in the ground, and must comply with the law. On behalf of the Board of Directors, this means we must bring some things to your attention.

### TRACK AND TRACE:

**THE NHS QR CODE:**  
Please scan the NHS QR code, posters of which are dotted around the ground. This works with the NHS track and trace app, which you should download. This is a Government and League requirement. The club will not be taking your details, unless you are unable to use this system. If that is the case please speak to the official at the turnstile. To get started, go to Android's Google Play or Apple's App Store and search for "NHS Covid-19".

[Note: unlike previous matches purchasing an online ticket will not count as completing trace and trace, please allow additional time to enter the stadium on a matchday]

### THE CLUBHOUSE:

We must by law comply with the licensing regulations now in force. This means:

**TABLE SERVICE ONLY:**  
Please take a seat at a table to be served by the bar staff. You can still take your drinks outside once you have been served. Please do not put the staff in an embarrassing situation by asking to be served at the bar. You must wear a face covering in the bar, unless sat at a table.

**CLOSING TIME:**  
No drinks can be served after 10 p.m.

**ENTRY AND EXIT:**  
Please enter through the main clubhouse door, BUT, leave by the side passage door

### IN THE GROUND:

**RULE OF SIX:**  
It applies in the ground!! Please be mindful, particularly on the clubhouse veranda.

If we don't not comply with the above the local authority can close the clubhouse and ground.

## RESULT: THE ROBINS RECIEVE SUPPORT FROM THE MATCHDAY SUPPORT FUND!



Great news for football in Frome, as we are celebrating receiving funding from the Premier League to help us navigate the impact of the Coronavirus on football and to help the safe return of supporters to The Robins' Nest.

The Matchday Support Fund grant will help us maintain and put in place further measures that will make their ground safer for the 2020/21 season given the challenges caused by COVID-19.

The Matchday Support Fund is managed by the Football Stadium Improvement Fund (FSIF), which is financed by the Premier League and supports non-league and Women's Football Pyramid clubs with the cost of improvements to their grounds.

The Matchday Support Fund follows the recent Pitch and Club Preparation Funds, which saw £8.7m in grants awarded by the Premier League, The FA and Government's Football Foundation to prepare the country's playing surfaces and facilities for the return of football.

Robins chairman **Derek Graham** said: "Clubs, including ours, are extremely grateful for the grant received to help us during this time. Every pound will go to helping the club get through this tough period and making sure that we can continue to have supporters safely in our ground. Together with our supporters, we can make sure our ground remains safe for all."

# UNDER THE SPOTLIGHT: JACK WITCOMBE

## FEATURE BY ROB BIRD

Fullback Jack Witcombe has hit the ground running since joining The Robins at the start of the season from Western League side Bradford Town.

Fulfilling "a dream of playing for his local club", Witcombe produced a performance to remember last weekend against Highworth, getting himself on the scoresheet in a resounding 5-0 victory that sees Frome climb to sixth position in table while also boasting two games in hand against fifth placed Slimbridge.

We caught up with Witcombe this week, to discuss all things Frome:

**RB:** What's the biggest, football related difficulty you've faced over the last six months with COVID-19?

**JW:** "Initially it was nice to have a break, but it wasn't long before I came to miss football and couldn't wait to get back playing and training. "It's always tough to motivate yourself from home too. I think quite a few of the lads found that difficult during lockdown."

**What's your biggest quality as a footballer?**

"I think my biggest quality is my ability

to get forward as an attacking threat, but also be defensively solid when needed; the position I'm playing now, right wing back, really suits my style of play.

"I also always try to have a positive attitude and show my passion, especially in games. I think having that mentality also helps you form strong bonds with your teammates, which is crucial."

**Are there any areas in which you could improve?**

"Although I'm passionate, I'm constantly trying to become more vocal and demand the ball more in wide positions during games. The more I can get involved in a match the better, I'd hate to be a passenger."

**How would you rate Frome's/ your campaign so far?**

"I think as a team we've definitely done well so far, but we're all just trying to carry the momentum through each game we play, and we're not letting ourselves get too hung up on any performances that are below our best.

"Individually, I think I've done well adapting to this league and getting used to playing in a more offensive position. I'm really enjoying my football and am looking forward to Saturday."



What personal football goals do you have?

"At the moment my main focus is on helping the team gain promotion this season, something I definitely feel we're capable of achieving.

"Frome are my hometown club and it's always been a dream of mine to play for them, so that only fuels my drive to succeed here, and getting promoted would certainly take me one step closer to doing that."

Who's your all-time favourite player and why do you idolise them?

"My favourite player is Cristiano Ronaldo, purely because of what he has brought to every team he's played

for in terms of leadership, goals, assists and ultimately silverware.

"He's an inspiration to every footballer, with his work-ethic almost as impressive as his ability on the pitch."

Who would make your all-time, dream five-a-side team?

"It's a question that's almost impossible to answer, but this would be mine:

A Kane Simpson brace and goals from Jack Witcombe and James Ollis helped The Robins return to winning ways in the Southern League, as they secured a comfortable 5-0 win against Highworth Town at The Robins' Nest.

The Robins took the lead very early on as top scorer Simpson latched onto Jon Davies' cross and converted from close range, his seventh in all competitions this season.

Simpson nearly scored his second just minutes later as he rounded The Worthians keeper Luke Kuczynski, but his effort went just past the post.

The home side asserted their dominance throughout the half as they controlled the ball and looked assured in defence, as the match meandered to the break with The Robins holding their lead.

Their dominance continues into the second half as both full-backs kept rampaging up the wings, and Joe O'Loughlin even managed a shot with 53 minutes on the clock but his effort went just wide of the post.

The Robins would extend their lead through right full-back Witcombe,

his first goal for his hometown club, as he just about evaded a Highworth defender to tap Davies cross home.

Just minutes later, Simpson would get this second of the evening as he scored with a sublime strike which gave The Robins a three-goal lead.

Simpson should have got his hat-trick as he headed James Ollis' cross towards goal but it rebounded straight off the post.

The home sides' lead would be strengthened through an own goal, as Highworth defender Tom Rejek headed Nathan Davis' cross towards goal.

The Robins secured all three points with a really commanding performance, sealing their second win this week, following Saturday's FA Trophy triumph on penalties over AFC Totton.

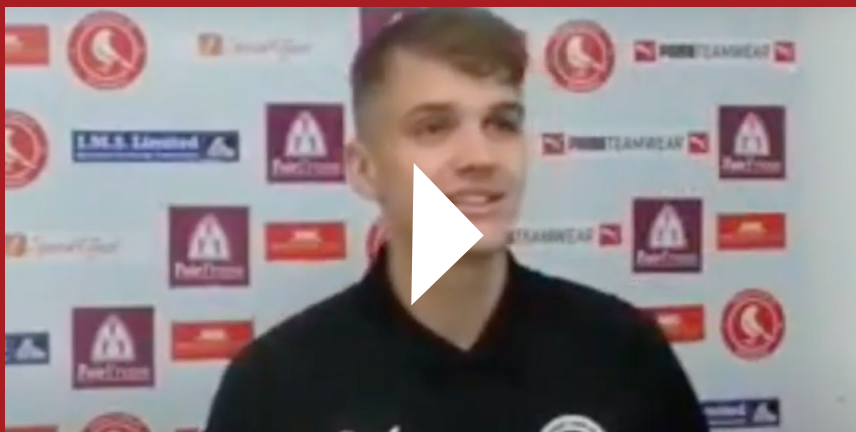

Frome Town Women travelled to Swindon Supermarine after a couple of forced weeks off to try and get back to winning ways.

The Robins matched the home side with an end to end 1st 10 minutes, forcing both keepers into regulation saves.

15 mins in Petteford tested the home keeper just inside the area with a strong shot which was pushed away for Frome's 1st corner. Petteford whipped in a dangerous cross which Underhill profited from with a nice glancing header which left Swindon's keeper no chance.

Frome's confidence grew all over the pitch and they started to dominate the play, with the 1st half coming to a close Thorner-Atkinson tried an audacious 35yard effort that saw the back peddling home keeper thank there wasn't a bit more on it.

Frome began the 2nd half full of confidence and on the front foot and it wasn't long before Christmas had Frome's 1st effort but pulled her shot slightly wide.

A sweeping move involving a great through ball by Underhill saw Christmas this time test the keeper who at full stretch pushed the ball away for a Frome corner resulting in goal 2 a carbon copy of the 1st. Underhill timing her run to perfection and glancing in another pin point cross.

With Swindon still a threat on the breakaway Frome put the game to bed with 25 mins still remaining with a nice move down the right, Petteford nicely released Thorner-Atkinson who looked as if she should of crossed from a difficult wide angle but decided to shoot and didn't disappoint with a pin point dipping shot into the far corner.

The icing on the cake came from the hard working forward Hill who received a good ball 25yards out and spotted the home keeper off her line and teased her with a perfect lob 0-4!

Swindon worked hard to the end and got their reward with the last kick of the game 1-4 final result.

A much deserved win by Frome and with excellent performances throughout the whole team player of the match was a tricky decision, with such a long list of candidates the opposing linesman was consulted and independently picked out Petteford as Frome's stand out player bossing the right hand side of midfield throughout.

# THE FIGHT FOR EQUALITY GOES ON...

With the 'black lives matter' movement continually fighting for human equality, we revisit one of our earlier features which endeavours to investigate racism within the Italian Serie A, which has seen the likes of internationally recognised strikers Mario Balotelli and Romelu Lukaku subjected to disgusting racial abuse in the past, proving nobody is exempt and equality is still squirming from a tight global grasp.

The Italian Serie A has always been renowned as one of the world's greatest footballing leagues, sumptuous to the taste buds of any football fan with fine players, coaches and stadiums, Italian football has become more powerful than ever of late, now ranking 8th among all professional sports leagues in revenue (2,267 million euros).

So, when accompanied by the incredible sun, food and quality lifestyle beautiful Italy offers, what's not to like for a professional footballer? Mario Balotelli, an Italian citizen himself has since, like many other players, been

the subject of racist abuse on multiple occasions with various Serie A clubs.

In February 2013 Balotelli, at the time a striker for AC Milan, was specifically subjected to racist abuse mostly in the form of monkey chanting and gestures from fans of city rivals Inter Milan, who at one point even hurled inflatable bananas onto the pitch. After failures from matchday officials to properly deal with the incident, Balotelli admitted to feeling alone in his battle against racist abuse, something he opened up about later that year to journalist Pedro Pinto (CNN).

"After what happened I felt alone, and if it happens again, I will leave the pitch. It's stupid.

"To the fans, support your team and come and watch the games, I understand they will insult players, but do not say racist things".

When asked if he felt "the officials and sporting authorities were doing enough"



to protect players from this kind of abuse, Balotelli raised his eyebrows before shaking his head, muttering "I do not want to say anything that will get me in trouble", a clear indication that there was, and still is no transparency and communication with players from the Serie A and other Italian footballing bodies.

This is further supported by the latest instance of racist behaviour from Italian fans, this time at the hands of Cagliari supporters, who once more pummelled racist chants and gestures at new Inter Milan signing Romelu Lukaku, who joined from Manchester United in August 2019 for a fee of £73 million.

What followed these events however provides the biggest shock, as Inter Milan fans wrote an open letter addressed to Lukaku, portraying the message "monkey chants aren't racist in Italy". The letter goes on: "You have to understand that Italy is not like other

North European countries where racism is a real problem". A sentence which sums up entirely the viewpoint of fans themselves, who support a team in perhaps the most racially damaged league of all.

Since receiving the letter, Lukaku has said he believes "football is going backwards" in terms of its fight against racism, something supported by England's Jadon Sancho, who stated: "racism is killing football" and by former Chelsea striker Demba Ba, who "urges black players to escape Italy's Serie A".

Since the incident, no comment has been made by Serie A, who seem completely unaware that racism is a major issue, and completely unmotivated to try and fix it. This begs the question, how dire does the situation have to get before governing bodies take action?

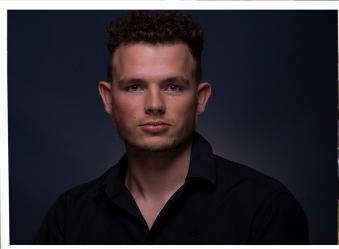

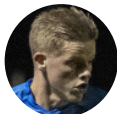

The club was established in October 1889. They played in the Cheltenham League, winning the Division One title in 1927–28 and again in 1929–30.

They joined the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League in 1935, but left after two seasons. Returning to the Cheltenham League, they were Division One champions again in 1948–49, before winning back-to-back titles in 1954–55 and 1955–56. In 1957 they rejoined the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League, but left again after finishing second-from-bottom in 1960–61. However, they returned for the 1962–63 season. They left the league again at the end of the 1963–64 season, but returned in 1965 and were runners-up in 1965–66, before going on to win back-to-back titles in 1966–67 and 1967–68.

In 1968 Cirencester were founder members of the Gloucestershire County League, but after a single season in the new league they moved up to the Premier Division of the Hellenic League. They were relegated to Division One at the end of the 1971–72 season, but were promoted back to the Premier Division after winning Division One in 1973–74. The club returned to Division One after finishing bottom of the Premier Division in the 1977–78 season.

The 1990–91 season saw the club finish as Division One runners-up, earning promotion to the Premier Division. They were Premier Division runners-up the following season, and won the league in 1995–96, earning promotion to Division One South of the Southern League.

The season also saw them win the Gloucestershire Senior Cup, beating

Endsleigh 2–1 in the final.<sup>[6]</sup> The division was renamed Division One West in 1999, and after finishing third in 2003–04, the club were promoted to the Premier Division.



The next few years saw Cirencester becoming a yo-yo club as they were relegated in 2007–08 and then promoted in 2009–10 after finishing fifth and winning the promotion play-offs, beating AFC Totton 3–2 in the semi-final and Bridgwater Town 4–3 in the final. They were relegated again at the end of the 2011–12 season after finishing bottom of the Premier Division, but returned to the division after winning Division One South & West in 2013–14. They won the Gloucestershire Senior Cup again in 2014–15, beating Shortwood United 2–0 in the final.

2016–2017 saw changes at the helm after a poor start Brian Hughes was relieved of the manager's job and Charlie Griffin was installed as his replacement. The 2017–2018 saw a brand-new state of the art 3G pitch installed at The Corinium Stadium. After a slow start The Centurions missed out on a playoff spot on goal difference and disappointment was to follow last season after finishing runners-up, promotion was denied via the play-offs losing to Cinderford Town FC in the semi-final by 1 goal.

Frome Town secured a narrow victory in a hard fought, somewhat scruffy game at Badger's Hill. The heavy pitch passed an earlier inspection but soon began to cut up.

Frome has an opportunity to open the scoring within the first minute or two when Kane Simpson narrowly failed to connect with a driven cross just a yard from goal and this was an early indication of the game to follow. The hosts dominated possession in the first 45 minutes without really creating any chances of note until the stroke of half time when a quick break saw a save by the Cirencester goalkeeper rebound to the feet of Dan Cottle who made no mistake and took Frome into the lead at the interval.

Cirencester started stronger in the second half as expected with a deficit to overcome and just a few minutes in had their best chance so far when a cross driven in from the right was narrowly volleyed over.

Immediately Frome broke and Kane Simpson rounded the goalkeeper only

to be brought down in the area. Alex Monks easily scores into the corner to double the lead with just 5 minutes played.

The visitors went all out attack from this point and started to pin Frome back, getting a breakthrough on the hour mark when Sam Teale tripped an attacking player to concede a penalty which was duly converted.

Cirencester continued to dominate with Frome restricted to the odd breakaway and Alex Monks was dismissed with a straight red card on 75 minutes handing the initiative to the visitors. Fortunately for Frome they were unable to capitalise on the extra player and they managed to see the game out, reducing the gap at the top of the table to 4 points.

# IF YOU KNOW YOUR HISTORY...

---

Frome Town, known at the Robins, were formed in 1904 and played in the Wiltshire Premier League. Early success came in the form of three Somerset Senior League Championships in between 1906 and 1911, whilst in between the Wiltshire League Championship was won in 1909-10.

The Club reached the Fifth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup in 1911-12 under the old format of the competition, which was today's equivalent of the Third Round proper losing 4-1 at Southport Central, in front of a crowd of 3,366.

Frome entered the Western League in 1919 and immediately became Division 2 Champions while the Somerset FA Senior Cup was won in successive seasons 1932-22 & 1933-34 & for a third time in 1950-51.

Frome have always played at Badgers Hill and the ground held its biggest gate in 1954 when 8,000 spectators saw Leyton Orient win 3-0 in the FA Cup First Round Proper. In the same season promotion was gained to Division One of the Western League & were beaten finalists in the inaugural Western League Cup.

Promotion was gained back into the Western League after a spell in the Wiltshire League again in 1962-63 where the club remained until 2009. Success was gained in the Somerset Premier Cup in 1966-67 with victory over Yeovil Town in the final and the cup was shared by the same two teams in 1968-69.



Frome's greatest triumph came in 1978-79 when the club won the Western League Championship by losing only once in the last 32 matches. The League Cup followed in 1979-80.

Another vintage year followed in 1982-83 with victories in both the Somerset FA Premier Cup and the Western League Cup, plus runners-up in the league.

Following those heady days, Frome flirted all too often with relegation from the Premier Division, and were relegated in 1995-96 and the Club spent several years in the lower reaches of the First Division.

The Club was re-structured off the field in 1999-00 but despite the ground being upgraded unfortunately success on the field did not follow with a re-structure of the league saving the Club from relegation into County football.



Frome improved rapidly and after finishing third continued upwards as they won promotion back to the Western League Premier Division after a six year absence the following year & also reached the final of the league cup.

With Frome struggling to win at home during the 2003/04 season the Club turned to the help of a local "White Witch", Titania Hardie. This move brought huge media interest from all over the World. It worked immediately and they went on a magnificent run that saw them go on to finish 3rd in the league.

The 2004-05 season saw the Club celebrate their centenary & events on the field saw the Robins reach the Quarter-Finals of the FA Vase before eventually losing 3-0 at Jarrow Roofing.

A seventh, third and fourth placed finish saw the club continually improving and then runners-up spot in 2008-09 secured promotion into the Southern League for the first time in the Clubs history. The Somerset Premier Cup was also secured with a 3-1 win over local rivals Paulton Rovers.

After a poor start to life in the Southern League and a quick change of manager Frome went on an incredible unbeaten run and finished the season in sixth

place and just three points from a play-off place. 12 months later and Frome beat Sholing 1-0 in the play-off final to secure promotion to the Southern Premier Division.



The summer of 2011 also saw the Club receive the prestigious FA Charter Standard Community Club status and, in 2012, after a great first season in the Southern Premier Division the Club were awarded the title of Community Club of the year for Somerset and then also picked up the regional award that took them into the national final.

Over the last few seasons the Robins have retained their league status while also finishing as runners-up in the Southern League Cup and the Somerset Premier Cup.

2016/17 was our most successful league season to date with the Club finishing in a respectable 8th place in the Southern League Premier division with our highest points total.

After a difficult season Frome were relegated back to Division 1 of the Southern League at the end of the 2018/19 season. With wholesale squad changes it will be interesting to see how this season develops.


