IN THE SPOTLIGHT: SAM TEALE

FEATURE BY ROB BIRD

With the season coming to a close, and Frome still on a serious promotion hunt, who better to catch up with than captain **Sam Teale**, who shone some truthful light on The Robins' goals, issues and capabilities.

Do you genuinely believe Frome can win the league this year?

"I do, after last year I feel that anything less than promotion would be an underachievement. Of course it's always amazing to go up through the playoffs, but it's our ultimate goal to win this league, and get back to where should be."

How do you think Frome will fare if promoted?

"We can't get ahead of ourselves, but we're a solid unit and have a much better squad now than we did last year. Half the battle is also about having a good group of lads who can bounce off one another, this season all the boys are like best mates,

and that will set us in good stead if everyone is to stay at Frome."

What's been the toughest thing about being team captain this year?

"Toughest thing is being fines master, some of the squad are tight as ***** you might say, it's really tough getting the money out of some, but as team captain it's a responsibility I'm expected to take on."



Where does the squad need improving?

"I think in terms of quality we're fine, as I said we're a better side now than we were last year, but I do think we need to improve in depth, just to handle the amount of games we play and the injuries that naturally come through that".

If the opportunity arises to play at a higher level, would you?

"A tough question and one which totally depends on the situation, unless it was a few leagues higher I'd



say no, Swindon (Supermarine) asked me to play for them in the league above this year and I refused because I wanted to stay at Frome.

"It's my ambition to play with Frome in the league above again, and possibly the league above that at some point. I've been here for 4 or 5 years now, and I can honestly see myself staying for the next 4 or 5."

Where do you need to improve personally?

"I need to be adding more goals to my game, I used to score quite a few but they've seemed to have dried up over the last 2 years. It's always good when you can help the attacking boys out and ease the pressure a little".

What plans are in place entering the final stages of the season?

"It's crucial we keep producing performances at the high levels we've

been hitting of late, keep working hard. Nothing is a given in this league and everyone wants to beat us because we're right at the top, so we have to keep raising the standards and keep the intensity sky high".

Message to the fans...

"Please stick with the boys and keep coming to the games, our home form I believe is the best in the league because we always have amazing support who fully get behind us. When we went through a rough patch I saw some people on Facebook saying 'we need signings and strikers and this and that', and I think a huge part of it is sticking together, teams are going to go through spells like that, but it's crucial you stick behind the boys who have done so well so far this season – saying we need new players is silly. We've got more than enough to win this league, and that's what we intend to do."

Frome Town consolidated their position at the top of Division 1 in the Southern League with a hard fought win against Slimbridge. Slimbridge has been the first team to beat Frome this season in the reverse fixture and again provided a tough test. Frome began kicking against a very strong wind and, in truth, the first half was a pretty flat affair and it was 32 minutes before the first meaningful attack on goal with a shot from in form Jon Davies going just wide after the hosts had a lot of possession without really creating much and the half time interval arrived with neither goalkeeper called on to make a save.

With the benefit of the wind at their back in the second half Frome began positively with the opportunity to get in behind the Slimbridge defence. Just after the restart Lenihan drove a low cross along the 6 yard box but no one was on hand to convert and then, in the 52nd minute Jon Davies rounded the goalkeeper only to be

brought down for a certain penalty which he duly dispatched low to the goalkeepers left to give the visitors the lead with his 7th goal in 3 games. This spurred Slimbridge into action in search of an equaliser and they created several chances with some skill full attacking play at pace, only the acrobatics of Phillips in the Frome goal and the crossbar keeping the score level.

The game continued in much the same vein with Frome defending resolutely and attacking on the counter whilst Slimbridge pressed for the equaliser until 3 minutes from time when a clever flick on found Rex Mannings free in the penalty area with only the goalkeeper to beat which he achieved with a deft chip to make it 2-0. Due reward for his efforts after having an earlier effort somehow hooked of the line by a defender.

The game wasn't quite over as Slimbridge scored a great goal in the 90th to set up a nervous few minutes of injury time but the visiting defence held firm.

The club was founded in 1914. They were in abeyance during the 1940s after losing use of the Plain Ham ground, but returned to footballing activity in 1951.

The club won the Somerset Junior Cup in 1962–63, and joined the Somerset Senior League in the 1970s. The club won the League Cup in 1974–75 and the Somerset Senior Cup the following season. In 1976 the Western League formed a new Division One, which Larkhall becoming founder members. In 1988–89 they were Division One champions, but were unable to take promotion.

They won the Somerset Senior Cup for a second time in 2003–04, and after winning Division One again in 2008–09 the club were promoted to the Premier Division.

In 2010–11 Larkhall were Premier Division champions, but were denied promotion to the Southern League due to ground grading requirements.

To meet FA grading requirements, applications for funding to Sport England and Football Stadia Improvement Fund were successful, securing 50% of the cost of the project to construct new changing rooms and to extend and update the clubhouse to provide improved hospitality facilities for spectators and visiting officials. Work started in December 2012 and the formal opening of the new facilities was celebrated with guest of honour the Mayor of Bath, Councillor Malcolm Lees, in August 2013. This work

and additional work was completed to enable the club to accept promotion in Their double winning centenary year

In 2013–14 they won both the Premier Division and the league's Les Phillips Cup, and were able to take promotion to Division One South & West of the Southern League.

In their first season in the Southern League the club finished fifth, qualifying for the promotion play-offs; after beating Evesham United 3–0 in the semi-finals, they lost 3–2 to Stratford Town in the final.

The club has played at the Plain Ham ground since their formation, initially renting it on a match-by-match basis. A longer lease was secured from Bath City Council in 1962 and a clubhouse built in 1965. Floodlights were installed in 2004 and the club bought the freehold of the site the following year. In 2008 55 seats were installed, with the amount of covered standing tripled.

Shaun Semmens (28) Goalkeeper.

An athletic shot-stopper, Shaun signed in January 2017 from Mangotsfield United, having started his career playing for Godolphin Atlantic in Cornwall. He was awarded man of the match twice in his first 5 games for the Larks.

Mike Baker (26) Defender; club captain. A left-sided centre-half with a big presence, Mike transferred to the Larks from Yate Town in 2017. A schoolboy at Bristol Rovers, his other previous clubs include Mangotsfield United and Odd Down.

Josh Jones (24) Defender.

An imposing and consistent centre-half, Josh signed for the Larks from Mangotsfield in 2017. He has also played for Clevedon and Cribbs.

Wayne Nderemani (20). Defender/wing back. Wayne is a 2018 signing for the Larks, an exciting, tenacious and lively full-back who can also play as a winger. He joined the Larks from the Bath City Academy. Sponsored by Anthony Waterhouse, Kathy Jordan & Catriona Glen

Dan Restorick – (20) Defender/midfield. Dan is a product of the Larkhall u18s side who scored on his first team debut in 2016 and had had a very successful spell in New Zealand last season. He can play at defence or in midfield. Sponsored by Larkhall Athletic Supporters' Club

Jaiden Savery (23) Defender.

An unflappable and consistent full-back, Jaiden has come through the Larks' u-18s and Reserves sides and joins the first team on a dual reg basis with Odd Down.

Tom Warren (31) Defender.

A very experienced centre-half, Tom signed from Melksham in November 2019. He was at Mangotsfield for a number of years and has also played for Yate Town.

Geraint Bater (39) Midfielder.

Bates is a central midfielder with a fine pedigree who started out at Bristol Rovers and has also played for Newport

County as well as a number of Southern League sides. He became the Larks' assistant manager in November 2015, and was first team manager from October 2016-January 2017.

Matt Britton (24) Midfield.

Ginge is a robust presence at the heart of the midfield who can also fill in at central defence. He joined the Larks from Western League side Cadbury Heath in 2017. He was our joint second top scorer in his first season.

Jack Camm (27) Midfield.

Busy and versatile midfielder Jack makes a welcome return after a few years' absence. He has also played for Yate Town and Cinderford.

Jack Dancey (23) Midfield.

Jack is a versatile defender/midfielder whose last club was Whitley Bay. He has also featured for English Colleges and Durham University.

Dale Evans (32) Midfield.

Dale is a very experienced and sought after central midfielder who signed in 2019 from Paulton Rovers. Other previous clubs include Mangotsfield Utd, Taunton Town, Yate Town, Cinderford Town and Newport County. Sponsored by Larkhall Athletic Supporters' Club

Harry Hope (25). Midfield/forward.

A new signing in the 2018-19 season, Harry is an attacking midfielder, strong in possession, who can play as a centre-forward or on the wing. Previous clubs include Cardiff Met University and Nailsea United.

Alex Lambert (28) Midfield.

A fast and strong left-sided winger, Alex joined the Larks in 2016 from Brislington where he featured in the side that reached the FA Cup 1st round. Previous clubs also include Mangotsfield United and Yate Town. Second top scorer in the 2017-18 season.



Thomas Hillman (19) Forward.

Our most recent signing, Tom is a tricky striker who began his career at Newport County before moving to Mangotsfield Utd.

Mitchell Page (31) Centre-forward.

A powerful presence in our front line, Mitchell is a very experienced Southern League forward. His previous clubs include Weston-super-Mare, Frome Town, Mangotsfield United, Paulton, and Yate Town.

Brad Norris (25) Striker.

Hard-working forward Brad returned to the Larks in 2019 after spells at Bath City, Melksham and Frome Town.

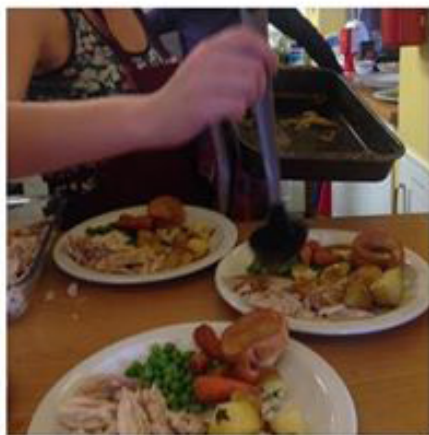

IF YOU KNOW YOUR HISTORY...

Frome Town, known at the Robins, were formed in 1904 and played in the Wiltshire Premier League. Early success came in the form of three Somerset Senior League Championships in between 1906 and 1911, whilst in between the Wiltshire League Championship was won in 1909-10.

The Club reached the Fifth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup in 1911-12 under the old format of the competition, which was today's equivalent of the Third Round proper losing 4-1 at Southport Central, in front of a crowd of 3,366.

Frome entered the Western League in 1919 and immediately became Division 2 Champions while the Somerset FA Senior Cup was won in successive seasons 1932-22 & 1933-34 & for a third time in 1950-51.

Frome have always played at Badgers Hill and the ground held its biggest gate in 1954 when 8,000 spectators saw Leyton Orient win 3-0 in the FA Cup First Round Proper. In the same season promotion was gained to Division One of the Western League & were beaten finalists in the inaugural Western League Cup.

Promotion was gained back into the Western League after a spell in the Wiltshire League again in 1962-63 where the club remained until 2009. Success was gained in the Somerset Premier Cup in 1966-67 with victory over Yeovil Town in the final and the cup was shared by the same two teams in 1968-69.



Frome's greatest triumph came in 1978-79 when the club won the Western League Championship by losing only once in the last 32 matches. The League Cup followed in 1979-80.

Another vintage year followed in 1982-83 with victories in both the Somerset FA Premier Cup and the Western League Cup, plus runners-up in the league.

Following those heady days, Frome flirted all too often with relegation from the Premier Division, and were relegated in 1995-96 and the Club spent several years in the lower reaches of the First Division.

The Club was re-structured off the field in 1999-00 but despite the ground being upgraded unfortunately success on the field did not follow with a re-structure of the league saving the Club from relegation into County football.

Frome improved rapidly and after finishing third continued upwards as they won promotion back to the Western League Premier Division after a six year absence the following year & also reached the final of the league cup.

With Frome struggling to win at home during the 2003/04 season the Club turned to the help of a local "White Witch", Titania Hardie. This move brought huge media interest from all over the World. It worked immediately and they went on a magnificent run that saw them go on to finish 3rd in the league.

The 2004-05 season saw the Club celebrate their centenary & events on the field saw the Robins reach the Quarter-Finals of the FA Vase before eventually losing 3-0 at Jarrow Roofing.

A seventh, third and fourth placed finish saw the club continually improving and then runners-up spot in 2008-09 secured promotion into the Southern League for the first time in the Clubs history. The Somerset Premier Cup was also secured with a 3-1 win over local rivals Paulton Rovers.

After a poor start to life in the Southern League and a quick change of manager Frome went on an incredible unbeaten run and finished the season in sixth

place and just three points from a play-off place. 12 months later and Frome beat Sholing 1-0 in the play-off final to secure promotion to the Southern Premier Division.



The summer of 2011 also saw the Club receive the prestigious FA Charter Standard Community Club status and, in 2012, after a great first season in the Southern Premier Division the Club were awarded the title of Community Club of the year for Somerset and then also picked up the regional award that took them into the national final.

Over the last few seasons the Robins have retained their league status while also finishing as runners-up in the Southern League Cup and the Somerset Premier Cup.

2016/17 was our most successful league season to date with the Club finishing in a respectable 8th place in the Southern League Premier division with our highest points total.

After a difficult season Frome were relegated back to Division 1 of the Southern League at the end of the 2018/19 season. With wholesale squad changes it will be interesting to see how this season develops.
