

Bee Group Newspapers leverages the SCS Community Publishing System to increase productivity and lower production costs.

SITUATION

Owned and operated by the same family for more than 115 years, Bee Group Newspapers serves the suburban communities surrounding Buffalo, New York. Through the years, the organization's mission has been for each of its nine locally edited newspapers to be a vital part of the communities in which they are distributed.

For many years, Bee Group Newspapers used a proprietary system to layout and publish its newspapers. However, that system was showing its age.

"We were relying on an outdated publishing system with in-house servers that dated back to 2003 and didn't have backup capabilities," said Mike Measer, Vice President of Bee Group Newspapers. In other words, if there were a hardware failure, the company would not be able to publish.

Mike continued, "Not only was the system old, but it also relied on a complex markup language and proprietary pagination tool. This made it very difficult to train new reporters and editors to use the system because the younger generation is used to working with more modern publishing software such as Adobe InDesign."

Further, maintaining the outdated publishing system through annual service fees was becoming far too expensive and upgrading the system would be even more costly.

"Looking at the relative cost to modernize our publishing operations, we knew we needed the ability to operate in the cloud and overhaul the way we do things here," said Mike. "Fortunately, we found SCS and began using its Layout-8000 pagination software."

Layout-8000 is an advertising dummying system that ties advertising systems to editorial systems. This allows newspapers to produce efficient, profitable, and well-designed editions quickly.

"The decision to use Layout-8000 led to a comfortable working relationship," said Mike. "So, we went back to SCS to find a solution that would complete the modernization of our entire operation."


The solution that SCS provided was the Community Publishing System (CPS), a content creation, curation, and multi-channel distribution system with edition planning and monitoring.
