


Fun Folds Class

Dahlia Fold



1. Fold your Mint Macaron cardstock in half and crease with your Bone Folder.
2. Run the piece of Mint Macaron through the Stamp, Cut, & Emboss machine (SCEM) with the Time Worn Type 3D folder.
3. Punch 8 total circles using the 2" Circle punch (retired).
4. You want your side that faces front on the card facing down on your surface.
5. Fold the circle in $\frac{1}{2}$ then $\frac{1}{2}$ again making 4 quadrants. Keep them folded and pick the top & bottom layer to fold the lip up on.



6. Open it up and you should have the two “lips” next to each other. Now flip it over and (like making paper airplanes) fold the lip towards the center line and crease. Repeat on the other side.
7. Once all 8 have been folded, it’s time to adhere to a 2” circle of cardstock. The easiest way to have them line up is to put them down in N, S, E, & W. All the tips should be in the center of the cardstock circle.



8. Once they are all on the circle, turn it over and rub the circle to ensure the adhesive stays put.
9. Stamp your sentiment on the Petal Pink with Basic Gray and cut out the flower using the piece of Brushed Gold.
10. Adhere all the pieces together on the front of the card. Adorn the flower with a Champagne Jewel.

Pocket Fold Card



Supplies Needed:

Card base: 5 ½" x 8 ½" Crumb Cake

DSP: 3 ¼" square; 5"x 1 ¼";

Colored Cardstock: Early Espresso 3 ½" square, (2) 4"x ½"; (1) 5 ¼"x 1 ½"

(2) Very Vanilla 5 ¼" x 4 (one for inside, the other to stamp/cut)

(1) Early Espresso with Adhesive Sheet on back @ 2 ¾" x 3"


1. Fold your Crumb Cake card base in half and crease with your Bone Folder.
2. Use your grid paper at the center where the "0" is and measure the bottom front of your card. The end of each side should be on the 2 ¾" mark on each side of the "0". Take a pencil and mark,
3. Now take the side front of each side and measure lining up the crease line of the card base on the "0" line. Flip and repeat on the other side. See figures below.



4. Place cardstock into paper trimmer track mid-point at the bottom-front of the card & the mid-point of the side-front of the card. Be sure both points are in the track and use the SCORE blade to SCORE (not cut). Fold up towards the center of the front of the card.
5. Fold the opposite side to match the edges together. See figure below.



6. Now to work with the other pieces before adhering to the card base. Take your DSP square and cut it in the paper trimmer. Line it tip to tip in the track and cut. Do the same with the Early Espresso square. This will go on the triangle pocket front. The other triangle will be cut in half again. See figures below.



7. Now take the small strips of Early Espresso and put adhesive in the middle. Line it up to the longest edge of each of the smaller triangles, trim the edges.



8. Glue down the inside piece of Very Vanilla and then place the two smaller triangles to line up on the left and right side of the inside piece.
9. Glue the Early Espresso strip and DSP strip together and glue to the top.
10. Stamp with Early Espresso the Cottage Rose and Leaf using the other Very Vanilla piece.
11. Place Adhesive sheet on the back of the Early Espresso piece and cut out the flowers.
12. Use Dimensionals to pop up the flower. Be sure to only put Dimensionals on the bottom of the flower so you don't glue shut the pocket.
13. Adhere the leaves and flowers. Follow up with Wink of Stella by brushing over the lines inside the image to bring out the color.

Flip Up Corner Fold




Supplies:


Card Base: Blackberry Bliss 8 ½" x 5 ½"

DSP: (3) pieces of coordinating DSP all cut to 5 ⅜" x 4 ⅛"


1. To make the template: cut a piece of thin cardboard (I use old DSP cardboard from the packs) 2 ½" x 3 ¼" then cut it diagonally for your template.



2. Fold and crease your card base as normal. Choose which side you want the corner to be folded inwards. Trace the template up against it with the stylus of your Take Your Pick tool. Flip and do the same on the other side.



3. Invert inwards to form a triangle and crease once you get it to form the triangle corners.



4. Decide which DSP pieces you want for the front of the card, the inside top, and the part you write on. Use the card base as a template. Pull the DSP pieces how they are once you pull away the card base.

5. We will be using the same template to cut the corners off all 3 at the same time. This will ensure that they are cut how they will be glued down.



6. Stamp the flowers and cut out with coordinating dies. Glue the one inside on the bottom half so it pops when you open the card. Plus you don't want to glue it to the top part.

7. Adhere flower to the front of the card along with sentiment. Stamp on the inside where you write if you would like.
